

General Summary for Wednesday, 18 June, 2025



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 18 June, 2025

West to southwest breezes will feel cool over Scottish mountains, strongest toward the north. Cloud will be drawn onto western hills, some drizzly rain or brief showers. Higher cloud eastwards, often above tops. England & Wales dry and mostly sunny, warmest south.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Patchy cloud banks clear, then mostly sunny; light winds.

Sunshine?	Mostly sunny, some fair-weather cloud.	
Air clarity (below cloud)	Visibility very good, but misty some lower slopes inland at first.

How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Not expected	None expected

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 19 June, 2025

High pressure centred to the east draws very warm air in on southerly breezes through the rest of this week. Dry conditions, sunshine and fair-weather cloud, some patchy coastal cloud at times in west, locally gustier winds too. A more uncertain outlook into the weekend and early next week, a good deal of fine and warm weather possible, but risk of some rain or showery bursts at times.
