

General Summary for Sunday, 6 July, 2025



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 6 July, 2025

Cloud on higher hills with patchy rain for many areas in the morning. Later, a band of showers forms from central highlands southward into England, drifting down the Pennines; showers will give heavy bursts with a risk of few lightning flashes southern Scotland. Damp in Wales early, gradually improving.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Early rain into drizzly showers, cloud base tending to lift

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 6 July, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	West to northwesterly 25-30mph; westerly early in the day. Increasing through the afternoon, winds approaching 35-40mph over tops into nighttime.	
Effect of wind on you?	Walking impeded most of the day, becoming strenuous with buffeting gusts challenging balance on exposed ridges into evening. Feeling cool.	
How wet?	Showers, at times persistent	
(Precipitation and its impact)	Often raining early with heavy spots here and there, then drizzly rain much of the day on northwest slopes facing Anglesey. Generally easing through the day, though at times drizzly and damp on high slopes.	
Cloud on the hills?	Fairly extensive, some improvement; best breaks southeast	
	Fairly extensive over high terrain much of the day. North and west slopes nearest Anglesey regularly shrouded to middle slopes. Bases tend to rise, tops southeast of Glyder Fawr/Snowdon increasingly clear.	
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%, becoming 70% southeast	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Greatest chance of glimpses southeast of high tops. Good visibility out of cloud, often poor in rain on north/west slopes.	
How Cold? (at 900m)	8 or 9C, little change through the day. Feeling at/near freezing in the wind, notably into nighttime.

How windy? (On the summits)	Northwesterly 25-35mph, risk up to 40mph at dawn. Notable gusts over high tops and down south/eastern slopes.	North to northwesterly 20-25mph early, easing to 15-20mph, though gusty over tops.
Effect of wind on you?	Walking impeded in strongest wind, buffeting gusts may challenge stability in exposure. Feeling cool.	Fairly small much of the day, some uncomfortable wind in the morning.
How wet?	Morning showery bursts	Little or no rain
(Precipitation and its impact)	Several showery bursts in the morning, greatest chance east; risk briefly heavy. Fading to substantially dry conditions.	Small chance local spots of drizzly rain late in the day. May be entirely dry.
Cloud on the hills?	Lifting, largely clearing summits	Patchy morning cloud largely clears tops
	Fairly persistent over high tops from dawn, banks drifting down north and west slopes somewhat; east and south slopes substantially clear. Gradually lifting to clear summits though cloud caps may occasionally drift over highest tops later.	Patchy cloud drifts over high terrain early, banks occasionally pushing down slopes towards Anglesey. Lifting through morning, largely clearing summits, though always a chance of fleeing cloud caps over highest tops.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchy sun becoming fairly extensive. Very good visibility through some haze.	Fairly extensive morning sunshine, high cloud building through afternoon. Very good visibility though some haze.
How Cold? (at 900m)	6C rising to 8C. Feeling just above freezing in the wind.	6 or 7C, rising to 8C, further rising into night towards 10C.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 7 July, 2025

A generally settled start to the week as high pressure will become dominant across England and Wales Monday and Tuesday. Expect substantially dry conditions here through much of the week with good periods of sunshine. In Scotland, low pressure to the north will facilitate a consistent west-southwesterly wind, driving several weak fronts onto northwestern coasts as the week goes - often cloudy here with periods of rain, tending to be drier with sunny spells in east Scotland. Temperatures will be near average. Some uncertainty about next weekend - fronts are likely to continue drifting towards Scotland and north England, though possibly interrupted by dry and warm air from the continent.
