


Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

General Summary for Wednesday, 16 July, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 16 July, 2025

Fine much of the day for many areas, cloud covering some hill slopes in the morning, tending to lift above many summits. A little patchy rain mostly southern Scotland and northern England in the morning, tending to fade. Isolated showers into afternoon. Mostly light winds.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Largely dry, cloud lifting. Breezy morning.

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 16 July, 2025

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	West to northwesterly 20-25mph at dawn, easing during morning to 10-15mph, then less into afternoon. Later south-southwesterly, increasing a little up to dusk near west coast. Mostly small much of daytime, but early morning will feel noticeably breezy and cool over exposed slopes.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain unlikely Chance of an odd spot of rain around early cloud.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Early cloud lifting Patchy cloud mostly around northern hills from dawn into early morning, lifting to upper slopes then largely clear of most summits by late morning. 50% early morning, rising to 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of cloud and sun; high cloud starts to thicken from southwest later. Visibility excellent.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	9C rising to 12C. Feeling like 3C in early breeze. Above the summits

	Thursday 17 July	Friday 18 July
How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	South to southwesterly 15 to 20mph, reaching 25mph at times higher western tops; may increase a little during day. Fairly small, but feeling blustery over exposed higher tops and ridges toward west.	South to southwesterly 15 to 20mph, at times 25mph over higher mountains. Fairly small, but feeling breezy higher up, may start to affect balance on exposed ridges.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Drizzly rain west Feeling damp where in cloud toward west coast, some steadier drizzle at times, may become more persistent, though amounts small. Little reaching eastern hills.	Rain at times heavy, likely easing Rain and drizzle, fairly persistent early in day near to the west coast. Some heavier pulses of rain drifting northeastwards, more likely morning, tending to clear. May leave pockets of drizzle some western slopes.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Fairly extensive, breaks north/east Covering coastal hills likely all day, may fill in to lower elevations. Higher cloud base further inland and east, may be above tops for periods near and north of Ogwen. 20%, to 50% north/east	Extensive, rising slowly, some breaks Covering the hills widely in the morning above 400-600m, lowest toward west, to some lower slopes near coast. Bases tending to lift slowly to upper slopes, some breaks forming gradually afternoon, soonest north of the A5. 10% rising to 30% afternoon.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of sun mostly east and north. Visibility good below cloud, but mister toward coast.	Cloudy misty start, particularly west coast. Tending to improve to give a little sun and good visibility below cloud.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	13C where in cloud, up to 15C Carneddau, feeling humid. Above the summits	10C where in cloud, up to 12C northeastern hills. Above the summits

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 17 July, 2025

Humid air moves in from the southwest on Thursday with drizzly rain and low cloud particularly in western regions. A mixed outlook, as slack low pressure drifts slowly over the British Isles, giving slow-moving showers and increasingly thundery downpours, these most extensive over England and Wales into the weekend. Staying fairly warm, quite humid. Often low wind speeds, but south-southeasterlies may increase at times. By next week, west to southwesterlies likely to prevail, with some rain or drizzle at times mostly western Scotland, often dry further south and east.

Forecast issued at 16:00 on Tuesday, 15 July, 2025
