



General Summary for Friday, 25 July, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 25 July, 2025

Cloud and patchy rain in western Scotland clears east, progressively easing; far east Scotland substantially dry and clear. Patchy cloud over high English and Welsh summits in the morning, deteriorating with the arrival of patchy rain through afternoon. East Wales and south Pennines substantially dry and free of cloud.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Cloud often caps tops, more extensive for a time

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 25 July, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	West to southwesterly 15 to 20mph, occasionally reaching 25mph over highest tops.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, some uncomfortable breezes over high tops may briefly challenge stability.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	A little rain later afternoon Patchy light rain sets in over western hills for a few hours in the later afternoon; often drizzly on highest tops at this time.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Varied over higher areas, more extensive for a time Patchy cloud over some western tops in morning, starting mostly clear inland and eastwards. Banks of cloud lowering above 700-800m for a few hours into afternoon, locally lower near coast. Lifting and breaking later, though banks will often cap high tops. 40%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchy sun in the morning mostly clouds over, a few glimpses may reemerge later. Visibility very good below cloud.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	10 or 11C, little change all day. Mid-Wales may rise slightly higher. Above the summits

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Northwesterly 15-20mph, some stronger breezes over tops late in the day. Fairly small most of the day, ease of walking affected over exposed tops late in the day.	West to northwesterly 20-25mph. Trending northwesterly and some stronger breezes into nighttime. Comfortable walking often affected; stability at times challenged over exposed ridges/tops late in the day. Feeling cool.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Occasional spots of rain Small amounts of rain now and again, mostly west coastal slopes.	Substantially dry Chance of light rain in the morning, though may be only local spots, fading for dry mountains.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Fairly extensive, improving for a time Often covering higher mountains, lowest cloud base toward the coast around 500-600m, or lower in morning. Cloud base generally rising with breaks near tops towards east Wales. Hills west of Snowdon will struggle to clear about 700m. 40%	Tending to lift, best breaks in the southeast Banks of cloud at variable heights in the morning, some more extensive low fog on slopes nearest the coasts. Bases tending to rise, highest southeast hills with breaks to or above 800m. Cloud at times filling in over high terrain in the afternoon. 40%, up to 70% southeast tops
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Largely cloudy, increasing bursts of sun later in the day. Visibility good below cloud.	Likely only glimpses or patchy sun, possibly more frequent for a time. Very good visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	9 or 10C. Above the summits	8 or 9C. Easternmost slopes may rise to 10C. Feeling just above freezing in direct wind. Above the summits

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 26 July, 2025

Westerly winds with mixed weather will prevail through the weekend into next week, bringing patchy rain and some heavier showers at times pushing eastwards - Saturday into Sunday may be quite wet for the west of Scotland. Through the week, periods of rain will be punctuated with decent sun breaks, though northwest Scotland will struggle to clear for sun. Often breezy and feeling cool with temperatures lingering near or below average.
Likely remaining unsettled into the following weekend though details are uncertain.
