

General Summary for Sunday, 3 August, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 3 August, 2025

Rain, low cloud and fog ahead of a front will clear Scotland late morning and England and Wales afternoon - but high humidity may maintain a little drizzle and low cloud Wales (most likely SW). Cloud base may not rise sufficiently to clear higher mountains mainly in W Scotland.

Wet, windy and misty morning; then improving markedly

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 3 August, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly, 30-35mph morning, strongest highest tops. Easing middle of day to 20-25mph, and by late afternoon 15-20mph.
