


# Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

## General Summary for Sunday, 3 August, 2025



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 3 August, 2025

Rain, low cloud and fog ahead of a front will clear Scotland late morning and England and Wales afternoon - but high humidity may maintain a little drizzle and low cloud Wales (most likely SW). Cloud base may not rise sufficiently to clear higher mountains mainly in W Scotland.

### Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Wet, windy and misty morning; then improving markedly

## Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 3 August, 2025

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Westerly, 30-35mph morning, strongest highest tops. Easing middle of day to 20-25mph, and by late afternoon 15-20mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Will widely impede ease of walking and notable wind chill; becoming small afternoon.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain and drizzle; clearing into afternoon</b> Morning/early afternoon: Rain and drizzle, most frequent west Wales. From mid afternoon: Soon dry - possibly still isolated drizzle western hills.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Fog across the mountains - clearing into afternoon.</b> Extensive down to lower slopes in the morning, particularly west Wales. Through early to mid afternoon, hills more or less clearing - may still come and go highest tops west Wales for a while.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Less than 10%, rising to greater than 90% late afternoon</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Periods of sunshine from mid or late afternoon. Very good visibility after rain clears.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	12 to 14C warmest eastern summits. Will feel like only a few degrees above freezing point in the wind morning,
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits

## Eryri / Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	Monday 4 August	Tuesday 5 August
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>  <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	South turning westerly; soon 50-70mph. Will progressively ease from early afternoon to 40, or toward dusk 30mph. <b>Expect difficult conditions from lower slopes up. Sometimes general mobility challenging. Severe wind chill.</b>	Northwesterly; slowly easing through day from 35 to 25-30mph by late afternoon.  <b>Widely strenuous walking and considerable wind chill, mainly morning.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Heavy rain, clearing afternoon</b> Rain soon extensive, heaviest western mountains. Will clear to isolated showers early, possibly mid afternoon.	<b>Showers</b> One or two brief showers - though possibly the rain on and off for a few hours Snowdon range morning..
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>   <b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Persistent fog largely clearing afternoon</b> Shrouding the hills morning, covering many lower slopes west Wales. Changing abruptly early to mid afternoon, as cloud clears to above 750m, although perhaps still patches much lower near coast.  <b>10%; rising to 80% through afternoon</b>	<b>Very extensive at first: cloud base gradually rising.</b> After dawn, cloud base typically 550 to 750m, lowest toward the coast. By early afternoon, most cloud will have lifted above 800m, and may lift to above 900m through the afternoon.  <b>20% rising to 70%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine intermittently by mid afternoon. Visibility poor during rain, improving, but hazy.	Ranging from occasional sunshine Snowdon range to patchwork of sun elsewhere. Slight haze, but overall very good visibility.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	Varying between 9C and 13C, Directly in the wind, will feel like -5C.  Above the summits	6C; rising a couple of degrees or so through day, particularly well inland. Feeling below freezing point directly in the Above the summits.

## Planning Outlook

## All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 4 August, 2025

A mixed week: unusually stormy for August on Monday northern Britain, then intermittent rain though the week, most frequent and heaviest western mountains together with areas of low cloud and pulses of strong wind.
