

# General Summary for Sunday, 12 October, 2025



# British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 12 October, 2025

A glorious day for the hills in most places; sunshine and feeling noticeably warm above an inversion - fog in valleys and covering some lower hill slopes in the morning. Some patchy cloud drifting higher up, mainly toward northwest of the Highlands. Mostly light variable wind, locally some gusts, easterlies for Wales.

## Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Inversion on the mountains. Warm sun. Mostly light wind.

# Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 12 October, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	East to southeasterly 10-15mph or less. Gusty over tops and elevated passes, locally 20mph later in day.	
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small.	
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	
Cloud on the hills?	Early valley fog, tops above mid-level patches, all clearing afternoon.	
	Fog in the valleys from dawn, most extensive towards east and mid-Wales. This lifting after sunrise and dissipating though ribbon-like cloud banks will cling to eastern middle slopes for a few hours then likely to largely clear. High tops cloud-free all day.	
Chance of cloud free summits?	90% (above fog in morning); almost certain all terrain afternoon.	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Often sunny though some high cloud will weaken its strength. Excellent visibility on the summits above haze or early fog on lower slopes.	
How Cold? (at 900m)	12C. Little change or slight rise in temperature with increased altitude, 14C in places on high tops. Low terrain much cooler than hills early in day.

Cloud on the hills?	Mid-level cloud, mostly eastern slopes	Patchy cloud, inversion; clearer west
	Low fog from dawn fairly extensive over Berwyn group and eastern parts of Snowdonia NP, some cloud on middle slopes. Cloud lifts with patches between 500-800m, at times more sheet-like in the east. Terrain above 800m likely above cloud layer.	Varied valley fog and cloud banks on some slopes in morning, high tops likely start above the cloud layer. Cloud tending to drift higher up, and may cover higher slopes at times. Clearer overall in west.
Chance of cloud free summits?	70% (high summits above cloud)	60% (above cloud banks for a time)
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Often sunny on high tops, more mixed lower terrain, possibly quite cloudy east. Excellent visibility above cloud, hazy lower down.	Sunshine generally best in west Wales. The air very clear if above the cloud. Some mist lower down in morning.
How Cold? (at 900m)	11C, little change with height. Valleys starting much cooler.	9C, small variation from lower slopes upward in morning, whilst highest tops a degree or so warmer all day.

## **Planning Outlook**

#### All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 13 October, 2025

High pressure continues to reside over the country into the new week maintaining quiet weather. Varied low cloud and morning fog. Inversion conditions likely to remain over higher mountains for several days, then during midweek this may start to weaken as pressure begins to fall gradually. Light winds overall, an easterly breeze likely for Wales early-midweek. Uncertainty about the weather pattern development toward next weekend, some indication of strengthening south-southwesterly winds bringing some rain, but may not reach all areas. Later October has hints of chillier northerly air, especially in Scotland.
