

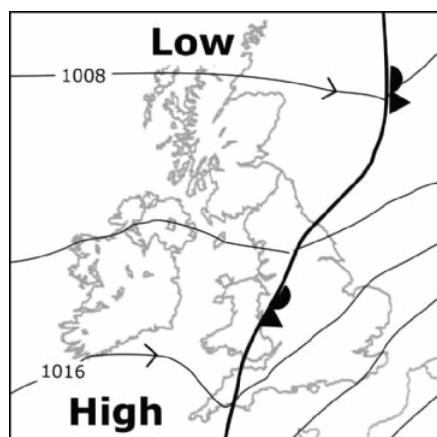

General Summary for Saturday, 22 November, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 22 November, 2025

As less cold air penetrates the UK, only higher summits in Scotland will remain below freezing point. Nevertheless, much mountains terrain will remain frozen and icy. Rain and strong winds overnight will have eased to in Scotland and through the morning will clear Wales and N England.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Showers. Fog tending to thin. Terrain partly frozen.

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 22 November, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly 45mph at first; veering west or northwesterly 20mph from west mid to late morning.
Effect of wind on you?	Strenuous walking with frequent buffeting and significant wind chill morning.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain morning; clearing to the odd shower Rain and drizzle frequent most of morning but from west easing to well scattered showers.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive, some rising into afternoon Shrouding even lower hills widely from dawn. Will improve, by midday, most cloud above 600m. By mid afternoon, breaks to 750m, mainly east Wales.
Chance of cloud free summits?	10%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Dull and misty morning; slowly pockets of sun coming through and below cloud visibility becoming very good.
How Cold? (at 900m)	2 or 3C. Feeling like -5C in the wind, nearer -10C at first.
Freezing Level	Above the summits - but expect patches of still frozen terrain.

Eryri / Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	Sunday 23 November	Monday 24 November
How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly, 30 to perhaps 40mph morning, but strengthening toward 40 to 50mph.	Northerly, 25 to 30mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Significant wind chill and arduous or difficult walking, particularly afternoon when general mobility may be challenging.	Will impede ease of walking across the hills, and at times in gusty conditions, balance may be tricky.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Frequent rain, heavy bursts Rain; frequent or in mid Wales showery. But may merge to persistent rain, particularly Snowdon range. Hail, and snow higher tops, and small risk thunder.	Little or perhaps no precipitation There may be light rain, or above 800m sleet or snow now and again, most likely morning.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive all day Cloud base varied, but widely covering hills above 500-800m, lowest near to west coast, where sometimes forming on lower slopes.	Cloud base rising - probably not clearing higher summits Morning: cloud shrouding higher areas extensively. Gradually cloud base rising toward 750 to perhaps 900m, but patches may come and go below 600m near and north of the A5.
Chance of cloud free summits?	10%	30%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Rare glimpses of sun if any. Visibility often poor in precipitation, otherwise good visibility although a haze.	Patches of bright sunshine slowly coming through. Visibility very good or perhaps in afternoon excellent.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	Around 0C. Will feel like -13C directly in the wind later in the day. 900m or above.	Around 0C - a marginal drop likely through the day Will feel as cold as minus 8C directly in the 900m.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 23 November, 2025

Another brief burst of cold air on Monday and Tuesday will bring further snow to northern Scotland. By Wednesday, milder air together with rain and strong wind will be extending across Britain. Rain and strong wind will be frequent, particularly on western mountains for the remainder of the week. In Scotland temperatures on the Munros will sometimes be below freezing point, but fresh snow probably transient, whereas elsewhere, snow rare if any.
