

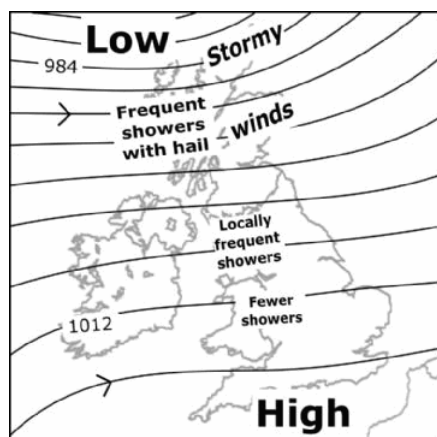

General Summary for Wednesday, 10 December, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 10 December, 2025

Storm-force winds continue over Scottish mountains, beware of storm damage and blocked routes. Gales remain severe over high terrain in northern England and tops in north Wales. Showery rain, hail and on higher tops snow in the Highlands, near-constant in the west. Bands of showers northern England, fewer for Wales.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Upland gales. Rain most frequent west.

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 10 December, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly 40 to 50mph, risk gusts 60mph over higher mountains, tending to moderate a little into afternoon.
Effect of wind on you?	Challenging walking conditions over the hills, difficult in places on higher terrain; considerable wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Showers Showery rain on and off, most frequent western areas. Wet underfoot, streams in spate, some flooding following previous rain.
Cloud on the hills?	Frequently on western high tops Cloud base varying, but often capping higher summits toward the west, better breaks north and east of Ogwen.
Chance of cloud free summits?	50%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Bursts of sun most frequent toward north/east. Slight haze west, poorer in showers.
How Cold? (at 900m)	3 or 4C, rising slightly into evening-night. Wind chill feeling like -10C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits

Eryri / Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	Thursday 11 December	Friday 12 December
How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	South-southwesterly 35 to 50mph, risk 60mph higher tops in Snowdon group. Challenging walking conditions, likely remaining difficult over higher tops.	Westerly 20-25mph, a gradual trend towards higher speeds, near 30mph widely by nightfall, further strengthening. Fairly small most of the day, but winds increasingly uncomfortable in exposure and feeling cool.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Little or no rain Drizzly patches mostly areas on or nearest the Llyn peninsula. Rain may then develop from west later evening into night.	Only odd showers west slopes Rain in east Wales at dawn soon clears. Scattered showers drift onto western slopes from Snowdon southward though most slopes often dry.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Patchy cloud some slopes Banks of cloud may linger around some slopes much of day, mainly south-facing areas. Toward the north of the A5, more likely the hills clearer. 50%	Mostly high terrain and west slopes Cloud will cling to the upper slopes of Snowdonia with lowest bases on western slopes, may reach as low as 600m during showers. Bases higher east with breaks, at times to summits. 50% east of high tops, 20% west
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sun best toward north. Possible haze or mist in places, otherwise visibility good.	Cloudy skies early break, best of sun in east Wales and lower slopes. Excellent visibility early, a haze building near the coasts.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	4C, may start to drop into evening or night. Feeling like -7 to -10C in the wind. Above the summits	2 or 3C. Feeling below freezing in exposure to wind. Above the summits

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 11 December, 2025

Staying unsettled as southwesterly winds prevail and low pressure systems pass to the northwest of Scotland; sustained gales over the mountains, severe or stormy for periods. Temperatures only just below freezing intermittently on higher Scottish tops, even here will experience spells above freezing with thawing, any lying snow patchy, but beware some icy surfaces on the very highest tops where some refreezing occurs. Driest in eastern areas on Thursday, otherwise rainfall will be frequent and heavy, sometimes showery with hail. Expect wet ground conditions and further flooding of streams and some rivers.
