



General Summary for Wednesday, 28 January, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 28 January, 2026

A fairly quiet day with plenty of dry weather and some good cloud breaks toward the west and northwest of major hill groups. Some snow flurries and low cloud lingers over the Cairngorms to SE Highlands. Moderate S-SE wind, locally gusty.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Gusty in places. Many hills clear, some sun.

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 28 January, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	South to southeasterly 15 to 25mph, strongest gusts typically toward western coasts, locally may reach 30mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small effect on walking most areas, but some sudden gusty spots around major tops and downslope to west, feeling chilly in exposure.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Dry overall
Cloud on the hills?	Patches, mostly clear north/west Some low cloud banks mostly on eastern hills in morning and returning after sunset. Odd patches on tops elsewhere, but many hills generally clear across west and north Wales.
Chance of cloud free summits?	80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sun and varied high cloud. Visibility very good.
How Cold? (at 900m)	0C rising to 2C. Feeling like -5C if exposed to stronger breeze.
Freezing Level	Close to freezing on some higher slopes from dawn, but tending to lift just above most high tops above 1000m; beware icy surfaces.

Eryri / Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	Thursday 29 January	Friday 30 January
How windy? (On the summits)	Southeasterly 30 to 45mph, stronger gusts in places through elevated passes and downslope west of higher tops.	South to southeasterly 20 to 30mph, may ease during daytime, but then risk increasing again after dark.
Effect of wind on you?	Challenging walking on exposed higher terrain, buffeting gusts not just on the highest terrain. Significant wind chill.	Some blustery areas, for a time affecting ease of walking and balance, considerable wind chill; may improve to be fairly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	A little rain or hill snow mostly east Patchy rain, falling as sleet or snow above 800m, most common Bala to Berwyn, patchier west, may be very little near coast.	Risk a little rain, often dry Patchy rain, some snow on higher tops above 800-900m, amounts small. Several hours at least may remain dry.
Cloud on the hills?	Fairly extensive, breaks northwest Covering many hills, lowest and most persistent eastern areas, some breaks above 800m north/west of Snowdon.	Low cloud east, clearer west Low cloud most likely across hills from Berwyn to Bala groups, higher bases and more broken westwards, may be largely clear some hills toward west coast.
Chance of cloud free summits?	30%	40%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Fairly cloudy, some brighter moments toward northwest, where visibility good if day. Mostly hazy, poorer if in rain/snow.	Cloudy and dull or murky eastern hills, but much better westwards, some sun best toward coast and Anglesey.
How Cold? (at 900m)	0 or -1C. Wind chill feeling like -12 to -15C.	1C. Wind chill feeling like -7C early in day.
Freezing Level	Variable, 700m in east, but just above freezing to some slopes above 900m further west.	1000m or just above.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 29 January, 2026**

Slow-moving weather patterns and a broadly similar regime to recent times over the next week or so. Scottish mountains generally below freezing point, with snow cover and drifts most substantial from the Cairngorms to central and southern Highlands, some additional falls in the week ahead, much less northwestward. Hills in England and Wales will see varying freezing levels, sub-zero for periods to 600m or lower, but intermittently lifting just above the tops - a mix of rain and upland snowfall. Wind speed will vary, some periods of lower speeds than recently, though gusty SE'ly winds remain common in the Highlands. Scope for widely colder conditions toward mid February.
