

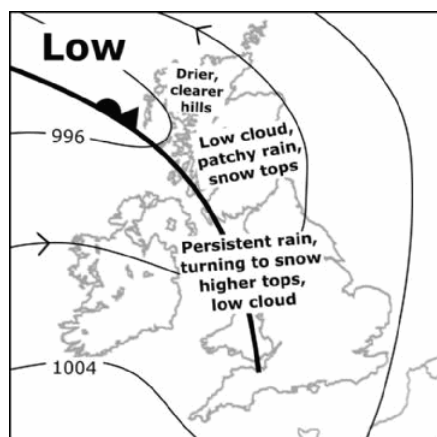

## General Summary for Sunday, 1 February, 2026



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 1 February, 2026

Extensive low cloud and patchy areas of rain, or snow on higher mountains, merging into more constant precipitation from the west over England, Wales and southwest Scotland. Driest conditions for the coastal northwest Highlands. Improving afternoon for Wales. Variable winds, dropping fairly light Highlands.

### Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Blustery, rain sets in, snow develops on tops; clearing later.

## Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 1 February, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	West-southwesterly 20 to 30mph, squally gusts during heavier precipitation, tending to increase generally and turn west-northwesterly later.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Starting to affect comfortable walking, more strenuous over exposed higher terrain, affecting balance on ridges. Considerable wind chill.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain becomes heavy, turns to snow high tops; clearing to showers afternoon</b> Patchy rain up to higher tops in morning, becoming persistent and heavier at times into middle of day, turning increasingly to sleet or snow above 700m. Fading into afternoon, but a few showers with risk of hail follow in west.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Extensive, later rising</b> Covering hills widely, from mid-slopes upward or some lower elevations in west for a few hours. Base rising into afternoon, breaks starting to form to upper slopes.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>10% later 30%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Overcast and dull, poor visibility in rain, very poor if in snow on tops; then some improvement later in day to very good visibility away from showers.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	1 or 2C, dropping to 0C afternoon. Feeling like -10C directly in the wind.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Just above highest summits in morning, but dropping to 800-900m middle of day into the afternoon.

**All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 2 February, 2026**

Southeast then easterly winds will prevail during the week ahead, strong to gale force over many hills for sustained periods. From Monday into Tuesday onward, colder air temperature and lower freezing level again, leaving mountain terrain widely frozen from mid-elevations upward, or to lower slopes in eastern Scotland. Further snow will affect eastern mountains, with additional accumulations and drifting. Some periods of hill snow for England and Wales into midweek. Cold easterly patterns are expected to continue onward into mid February, though higher pressure to the north may see reduced precipitation amounts, always driest with highest cloud in west.

**Forecast issued at 16:30 on Saturday, 31 January, 2026**
