

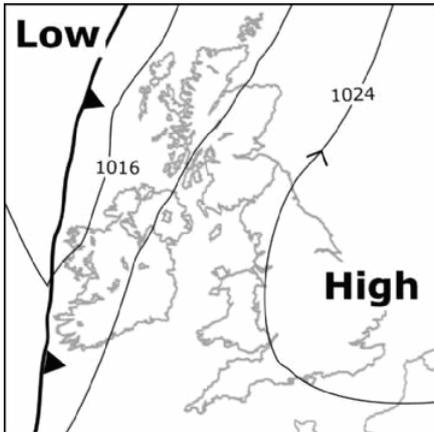
# Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

## General Summary for Sunday, 8 March, 2026



**British Mountain Summary:**  
**Based on forecast chart for noon 8 March, 2026**

A blanket of low cloud and haze (particularly Pennines) over England, Wales and SW Scotland will spread to the Borders and S Highlands later in day - albeit cloud breaks in places. The Scottish highlands mostly fine albeit windy in the NW with chance of a little rain.

**Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park**

Extensive fog, a little rain. Light wind.

## Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 8 March, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southerly 15mph, but possibly 20mph western mountains.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Small</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Patches fine drizzle at times. Heavier rain briefly.</b> Fine drizzle here and there, and almost anywhere chance of a burst of rain.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Will cover western tops</b> Extensive fog, the cloud base typically 400 to 600m by midday as cloud base begins to rise. Possibly breaking to clear some high tops afternoon - though uncertain.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>30%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Widely dull and hazy although the sun will come through in places.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	5C
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits, but slight frost some inland valleys at dawn.

## Eryri / Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	South to southwesterly 15mph	South to on higher slopes southwesterly; increasing with height to 25 to 35mph, but perhaps 40mph highest tops.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Small	<b>Notable ind chill and balance affected by the wind on exposed higher slopes.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Patchy rain; very little in total</b> Bursts, probably brief, of showery rain now and again. Some places may well stay dry, and total rainfall everywhere small.	<b>Rain now and again</b> Rain occasionally - little in total.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Very extensive - although cloud base rising, perhaps breaking.</b> Very likely blanket of fog from lower slopes up from dawn - though possibly breaks to some higher slopes. Cloud base will rise from late morning, and in afternoon, most cloud will be above 600 to 800m, and may substantially clear.	<b>Persistent most areas; highest cloud base east and far north of Wales</b> Generally persistent cloud above 450 to 600m. But may well be extensive at or below 300m Llyn peninsula to Snowdon. Highest cloud base easternmost hills and perhaps Carneddau where mostly 750 to 900m.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>10% rising to 40%</b>	<b>20%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Widely dull and misty or murky morning. The cloud slowly breaking in places, perhaps substantially in some areas (most likely N Pennines) afternoon and visibility probably improving to be very	Glimpses of sun some lower slopes - though more extensive east and north off the Carneddau. Generally hazy west Wales; otherwise very good visibility.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	4C	3C - only slow drop in temperature higher up. Will feel as cold as minus 6C directly in the wind.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits	Above the summits.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 9 March, 2026**

Increasingly wet and windy, particularly western mountains through next week. From Wednesday, bouts of upland severe or storm force winds will reach the Scottish Highlands and the gales periodically affecting other mountain areas later in the week. Freeze thaw cycles will occur on higher areas south from S Scotland whilst the Scottish Highlands experience infrequent thaw, with fresh snow sometimes reaching lower slopes, whilst extensive higher up.
