

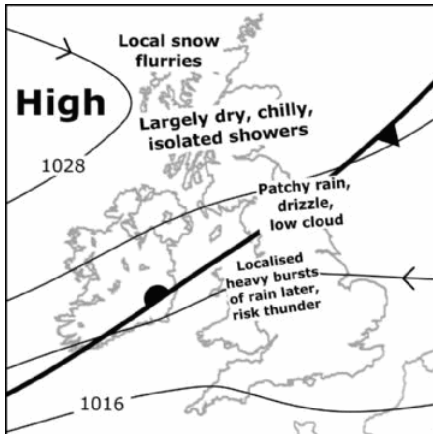
# Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Includes all summits in the the northern half of Wales from Pumlumon northwards.



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## General Summary for Saturday, 9 May, 2026



### British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 9 May, 2026

Chilly but largely dry with light winds for Highlands, broken cloud lifting above most tops, isolated showers / flurries. Greater chance of heavier showers south-central Highlands later. Grey and damp for the Pennines, fresh NE'ly winds. Localised heavy downpours near Peak District & mid-Wales later afternoon.

### Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Localised heavy downpours form, risk thunder. Gustier wind later.

## Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 9 May, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Northeasterly 10-15mph or less particularly inland and further south in morning, rising to 20-25mph, or 30mph in places later afternoon, gusty around higher mountains.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Feeling increasingly blustery and rather cool, more noticeably gusty around some tops and ridges, affecting balance in exposure.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Odd spots, then localised thundery showers later</b> A little patchy rain early in the day, an odd burst of rain, but mostly very little. Then increasing risk during afternoon of localised showers forming, later slow-moving heavy downpours, risk of thunder, particularly mid-Wales.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Varied, clearing for periods</b> Patchy cloud banks around the hills in the morning, tending to break and rise toward or above many tops. Western hills more often clear. Ragged patches form later at various heights during/after showers.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>60%</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Sun often weak through a veil of high cloud, tending to become overcast. Some early misty areas, then visibility very good, reducing where showers form locally.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	5 to 7C. Feeling like 0C or just below if exposed to wind.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

## Eryri / Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	Sunday 10 May	Monday 11 May
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b> <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Northeasterly 25 to 30mph and notably gusty particularly morning; speeds tend to lessen a little with time. <b>Blustery with considerable wind chill at least in morning. Gusty spots affect ease of walking and balance on ridges.</b>	North-northwesterly 20-25mph, may ease a little afternoon, turning toward west-northwesterly later in day. <b>Fairly small, but blustery in exposure on higher tops and ridges, distinctly chilly especially in the morning.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain unlikely</b> Chance of brief spots of drizzle or light rain early in the day, mainly north and eastern hills, otherwise dry.	<b>Local showers</b> Brief showers mostly near north coast in morning, snow flurries on higher tops. One or two showers forming inland into afternoon.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>  <b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Local banks clearing</b>  Cloud banks mostly drifting over east and northern tops in the morning, tending to lift higher and break above most or all tops.  <b>80%</b>	<b>Lifting and largely clearing</b>  Some cloud banks drifting over tops mainly in northern areas above 700m early in day. Lifting higher up during morning and breaking above the summits.  <b>70%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Fairly cloudy in east in morning, some sunny breaks toward the west coast; broken cloud and sun afternoon. Visibility very good or excellent.	Patchy sunshine develops. Visibility excellent.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	2C rising to 5C afternoon. Feeling as cold as -8C directly in the wind in morning, -3C afternoon.  Above the summits.	2C early morning, rising to 4C afternoon. Feeling like -6C in the wind in morning.  Close to freezing on highest summits early in day, then rising further above the tops.

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 10 May, 2026

A chilly outlook into mid-May, with higher Scottish mountains staying near or often below freezing point as northwesterly air prevails. Higher tops in England and Wales also dropping intermittently to freezing point. Wind-speed varying day-to-day, but prepare for often considerable chill-factor on all mountains. Some frost overnight into valleys when skies are clear. Broadly showery weather over the next 10-day period, plus some fronts bringing persistent rain mostly to northwestern Scotland, often falling as snow on mountain tops, sometimes to below 600m. Drier intervals too, some days with fewer showers and broken cloud lifting above the summits, varying locally day-to-day.
