

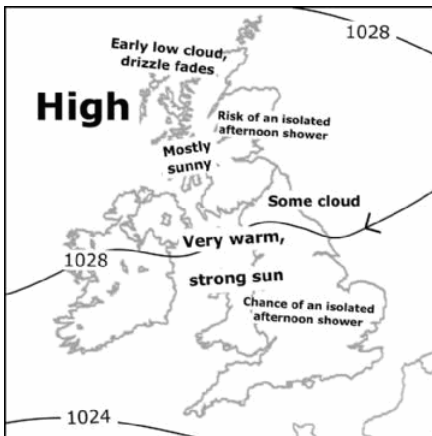

General Summary for Tuesday, 26 May, 2026



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 26 May, 2026

Low cloud and early drizzle in northwest Scotland, improving with cloud thinning and breaking, but staying cool toward the far north. Very warm and sunny for England and Wales. Chance of isolated late heavy showers forming, but mostly dry.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Very warm, sunny. Light wind.

Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 26 May, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Varying in direction, 5-10mph or less; locally up to 15mph some coastal hills where sea breezes develop.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Likely dry, chance a late shower south Very likely dry, but risk of cloud bubbling up in the afternoon to give an isolated shower mainly mid Wales, but should they occur, slow-moving heavy burst or thunderstorm.
Cloud on the hills?	Mountains clear
Chance of cloud free summits?	Practically certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Widespread sunshine, but areas of cloud will bubble up in the afternoon. Visibility mostly good or very good, but slight haze.
How Cold? (at 900m)	17 to 20C, humid. Hottest mid & east Wales where valley temperatures will rise toward 28C.
Freezing Level	Well above the summits

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Southeasterly 15 to 20mph, but up to 30mph at times as marked gusts develop, with highest gusts not always on tops. Rather blustery and increasingly gusty through the day.	South turning southwesterly, 25 to 40mph, gusty at first, then mean speed generally increasing afternoon, risk to 40-50mph. Blustery, affecting ease of walking and balance on exposed terrain. May become widely strenuous or arduous over hills.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Substantially or completely dry Perhaps the odd burst of showery rain possible very late in the day, running up the west coast.	Early thundery bursts likely clear Possible sporadic overnight thundery downpours ongoing through to dawn, may continue to drift northeast into morning, then may largely clear. Then more likely dry, but some fine drizzle near coast.
Cloud on the hills?	Largely clear, some early cloud east Early patchy low cloud confined to east Wales, will lift and break off the hills, to leave all areas clear by midday. Western mountains clear all day.	Varied, may fill in west coast Ragged patches over hills at varied elevations during and just after rain for a time in morning, likely to lift and clear. During afternoon, low cloud may roll in from Cardigan Bay over hills nearer coasts.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%, but 50% east Wales morning.	60%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of sunshine, increasingly sunny with thin high cloud, but may thicken later. Visibility good, but marked haze.	Varied sun and high cloud, more overcast skies likely for a time, mainly morning. Rather hazy, poorer visibility if in rain; may improve for a time, risk mistier later west.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	15 to 18C. Well above the summits	14 to 16C. Feeling like 5C or later cooler where directly in the stronger wind. Well above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 27 May, 2026

Very warm air extends into Scotland during midweek on southerly winds. Isolated bursts of rain form, greater risk toward Wales by Wednesday night, then drifting variably northward during Thursday daytime - some uncertain local detail and timing, but scattered thunderstorms are possible by this time. Winds also strengthening and becoming very gusty. Some rain in western Scotland by Thursday night which may linger into Friday here on westerly winds, but a fine end to the week for many places. Further rain and low cloud likely returns to western Scotland over the weekend, possible showers elsewhere. A more unsettled west-southwesterly pattern is likely into early June, cooler with rain and stronger winds for periods.
