

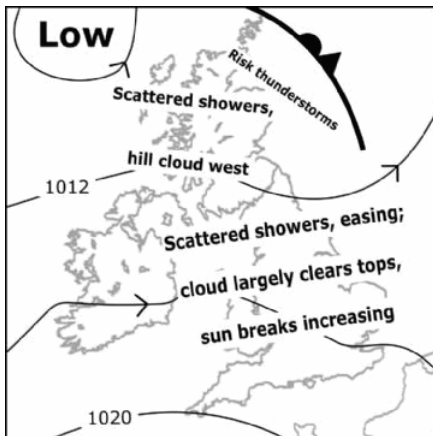

## General Summary for Sunday, 31 May, 2026



### British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 31 May, 2026

Showers in Scotland, most frequent west where hill cloud will linger; clearer east, cloud caps around showers. Early showers and hill cloud England and Wales, cloud lifts to just passing caps Scafell and Yr Wyddfa, sun bursts breaking out and showers largely fade. Moderate breeze, occasional stronger gusts high tops.

### Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Light showers, early drizzle in cloud, fading; breezy high tops

## Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 31 May, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Westerly 15-25mph, some early stronger gusts, and perhaps a few afternoon hours of lighter speeds.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Fairly small, though may be quite breezy on the high tops early in the day.
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Light showers, some drizzle, easing</b> Scattered showers drifting from the west, mostly light in nature, a lingering fine drizzle on high west slopes in the morning. An easing trend afternoon to just nuisance drizzle on high west slopes.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Fairly extensive, lifting to just caps on highest tops</b> Fairly extensive above 600m early, to 300m west slopes of Yr Wyddfa and southward; nearer 700-800m Carneddau. Lifting and breaking, many hills clear by early afternoon, but a lingering bank of cloud above 800m on western slopes; Yr Wyddfa only seeing fleeting breaks until later.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Rising to 70%</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Patchy sunshine, greatest chance of extended sunny breaks later in the day. Very good visibility but a building haze in the distance over the sea.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	8 or 9C.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

## Eryri / Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	Monday 1 June	Tuesday 2 June
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b> <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Southwesterly 25-35mph, likely gusty over tops and high passes, to 40mph over Yr Wyddfa, or higher for a few hours. <b>Walking strenuous in exposure, arduous for a time highest tops with notable wind chill; stability likely impacted.</b>	Westerly 20 to 25mph, occasional 30mph at least in gusts on tops. <b>Noticeable breeze, at times starting to affect balance on exposed ridges.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Constant rain sets in</b> Patchy rain from before dawn soon becomes frequent, setting in persistently for several hours with extended falls in the south and west. May ease somewhat north and east later in the day, but any dry windows very short.	<b>Heavy thundery showers, may fade</b> Showery rain on and off from dawn, some heavier bursts forming and passing eastwards morning into middle of day, risk isolated thunder. May fade for a time in west afternoon, some light showers later.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>  <b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Extensive</b>  From dawn, a deck of cloud shrouds western slopes from 400-500m up, locally lower; some higher breaks near Carneddau to start, possibly towards summits, but cloud fills in above 500-600m nearly all hills, always lowest bases west. <b>10%</b>	<b>Lifting toward tops, breaks form</b>  Cloud banks covering higher slopes most widely in west in morning, becoming confined above 800m and higher breaks into middle of day onward. Patches likely return over western tops into evening. <b>50%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Overcast and largely dull, particularly afternoon. Visibility poor due to low cloud but good at low heights.	Glimpses of sun, may become sunnier near west coast for a time afternoon. Visibility very good, reduced in showers.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	9 or 10C, little change with height; may rise a degree. Feeling below freezing in strongest wind. Above the summits.	8 or 9C. Feeling close to 0C if exposed to wind. Above the summits.

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 1 June, 2026

An unsettled week ahead with low pressure facilitating periods of rain, showers, and a strengthening wind, as well as cooler temperatures. Rain spreads across most areas from the southwest on Monday, followed by showers on Tuesday, these showers perhaps turning into thunderstorms in central and east areas. The only settled window this week overnight into Wednesday, then more rain soon arrives from the west through Wednesday morning, spreading widely and with it gales likely over most hills as well except the far north of Scotland. Thursday and Friday remain showery and windy, nearly persistent rain and extensive low cloud northwest England and west Scotland, a few breaks in the east but showers always most widespread afternoon and even smaller hills seeing cloud over summits for periods.

### Forecast issued at 16:10 on Saturday, 30 May, 2026
