

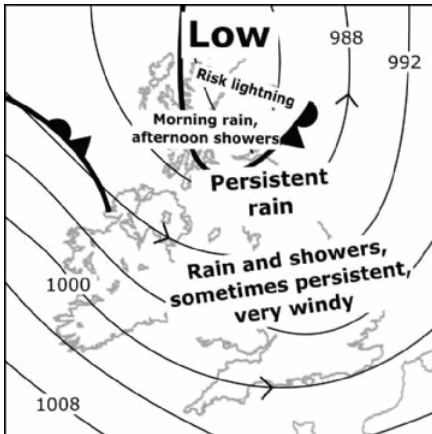
# Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Includes all summits in the the northern half of Wales from Pumlumon northwards.



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## General Summary for Thursday, 4 June, 2026



### British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 4 June, 2026

Rain and showers in Scotland, showers heaviest east afternoon with risk of thunder. Light wind early, increasingly blustery from south. Persistent rain and windy south Scotland and Lakeland/N Pennines. Very windy Peak District and Wales too, gales later, morning rain and afternoon showers.

Morning rain, afternoon showers; windy, particularly later

## Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 4 June, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southwest soon westerly, 25 to 35mph, perhaps stronger just before dawn. Some speed variability, and strengthening later in the day to 30-40mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Strenuous walking conditions for much of the day on high ground, some lighter moments but deteriorating widely late in the day.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Morning rain and afternoon showers, regularly heavy</b> A band of persistent rain sweeps east across the mountains for several morning hours. Once clear, a brief dry window with just fine drizzle over the summits, then showers stream in from the west, soon frequent and heavy with some risk of lightning.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Fairly extensive, varied, breaks east</b> Fairly extensive to at least middle slopes during morning rain. Lifting as rain clears, but covering higher slopes frequently, persistently in western areas above 700-800m, patches to lower slopes during and after rain; tending to lift higher afternoon with some breaks east of high hill groups.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>30%</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Some glimpses of sun afternoon in the east; any sunshine unlikely west of high hill groups. Visibility occasionally good below cloud, best chance afternoon east, but reduced in rain, at times poor.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	6 or 7C, little change during the day; may reach 8C Berwyn group. A notable drop in the later overnight hours. Feeling near -5C directly in the wind.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

## Eryri / Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	Friday 5 June	Saturday 6 June
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>  <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Westerly 30-35mph at dawn, gusty over tops, soon easing, 20-25mph. Shifting southwesterly too, later 15-20mph.  <b>Strenuous walking in exposure with notable wind chill early, effects gradually easing, fairly small later.</b>	S-SE'ly, then SW'ly, high uncertainty of extent of stronger winds - likely in range 35 to 50mph, but risk 60mph for a time.  <b>Beware of changing conditions and monitor subsequent forecasts - risk often arduous, difficult for a time.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Spotty rain, some drizzle</b> Spots of light rain here and there, some drizzle in cloud on high tops; plenty of dry windows too, little precipitation towards Carneddau. Some risk of later afternoon showers mid-Wales.	<b>Risk periods of heavy rain</b> Patchy rain likely from before dawn, may be initially small amounts into morning, but risk of more persistent heavier rain developing - timing of this uncertain. Rain and some heavier bursts continuing later in day.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>   <b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Mostly west, lifting to high terrain with breaks</b> Fairly extensive above 600m in the west in the morning, bases towards 700-800m in the east; lifting through morning, breaking up somewhat, many hills clearing, though Yr Wyddfa may only see short breaks; best breaks early/mid afternoon.  <b>Rising to 70% by later afternoon</b>	<b>Fairly extensive</b>  Shrouding many hills much of day, especially more western areas, from low-mid slopes upward especially in rain, highest bases toward Carneddau if drier.  <b>20%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	A patchwork of sunshine. Good visibility.	Overcast, mostly dull, poor visibility in rain, locally better if dry northern areas for a time; may start to improve later in west.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	3 or 4C at dawn, rising to 7C, little drop into night. Feeling like -5C in strongest early wind.  Above the summits.	5C rising to 8C afternoon, then lowering into evening-night. Feeling below freezing in the wind.  Above the summits.

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 5 June, 2026

Friday sees a slight settling trend compared to recent days with sunny spells in east Scotland as well as England and Wales, some patchy showers. Unsettled again over the weekend, as southwesterly flow draws several areas of rain across the country, best of dry slopes to the northeast. Showers affect most hills Monday and Tuesday, lowest cloud and most persistent rain along western slopes, but with some breaks as well with sunshine. Wednesday is likely more unsettled as gales spread across most tops and heavy rain drives into northwest England and Scotland. Conditions settling into the weekend as high pressure builds from the south. Low cloud will gradually dissipate for increased sun. Scotland slower to settle, some cloud and drizzly rain lingering in the west.
