

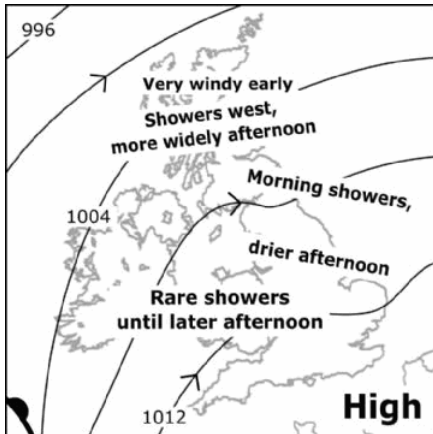
# Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

## General Summary for Friday, 5 June, 2026



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 5 June, 2026**

Blustery start, gale-force gusts in N England and Scotland; easing. Chilly with showers in W Scotland, showers more widely over the highlands afternoon with sunny interludes. Early showers in England and Wales ease by afternoon, only well-scattered showers remain over Wales and S Pennines, plenty sun breaks.

### Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Patchy sunshine, rare rain until late; breezy periods on tops

## Detailed Forecast for Friday, 5 June, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Westerly 25-30mph at dawn, soon shifting southwesterly and easing to 15-25mph, lightest winds on east mountains. Shifting southerly later, beginning to deteriorate western hills into night and more widely overnight.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Ease of walking impacted at dawn, perhaps strenuous in exposed places, but easing to fairly small effects much of the day until deteriorating as night approaches.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Well-scattered patchy rain, late afternoon showers</b> Spots of light rain here and there, some drizzle in cloud on high tops just at dawn; plenty of dry windows too, little precipitation towards Carneddau. Some risk of later afternoon showers drifting northward through mid-Wales into Eryri NP.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Mostly west, lifting to high terrain with breaks</b> Fairly extensive above 600m in the west in the morning, bases towards 700-800m in the east; lifting through morning, breaking up somewhat, many hills clearing, though Yr Wyddfa may only see short breaks until mid-afternoon.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Rising to 70% by later afternoon</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	A patchwork of sunshine, high cloud thickens through afternoon. Good visibility, some light haze around.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	3C at dawn, rising to 7C or a degree mildest towards Carneddau and eastward. Only small drop into night. Feeling like -5C in strongest early wind.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

## Eryri / Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	<b>Saturday 6 June</b>	<b>Sunday 7 June</b>
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b> <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	S-SE'ly, then SW'ly, uncertainty of extent of stronger winds - likely in range 30 to 50mph, but also lighter for a few hours. <b>Beware of changing conditions - risk arduous or difficult at times, but also a periods of lesser effects.</b>	Southwesterly 30-40mph, strong gusts over tops to 45mph, possibly stronger. <b>Walking strenuous, including lower slopes early, and often arduous over tops with considerable wind chill.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Risk periods of heavy rain</b> Patchy rain likely through much of the day, perhaps an extended heavy fall in the early hours. A few dry windows are probable, but always with a risk of returning rain, mostly from the southwest.	<b>Likely little rain</b> Some spotty rain drifting onto western slopes from time to time, perhaps a fine drizzle on high terrain in the early hours; most slopes may well be substantially dry most of the day.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Fairly extensive</b> Shrouding many hills much of day, especially more western areas, from low-mid slopes upward especially in rain, highest bases toward Carneddau if drier. A few fleeting breaks with higher bases here and there, maybe more often late.	<b>Lifting to high terrain</b> May be fairly extensive from middle slopes up in the morning, to the lower slopes west of high terrain. Lifting, likely largely above 800m, perhaps clearing summits of Berwyn group and Carneddau, but highest summits will struggle to clear.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>20%</b>	<b>30%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Overcast, mostly dull, poor visibility in rain, locally better if dry northern areas for a time; may start to improve later in west.	Weak sunshine through high cloud, increasingly patchy with time. Good visibility though a haze over the sea.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b> <b>Freezing Level</b>	5C rising to 8 or 9C afternoon, notably lowering into evening-night. Feeling below freezing in the wind. Above the summits.	7 or 8C, may rise to 9C Carneddau. Feeling near or below freezing in strongest wind. Above the summits.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 6 June, 2026**

Unsettled over the weekend as southwesterly flow draws several areas of rain across the country, best of dry slopes to the northeast, and perhaps a drier Sunday for England and Wales through blustery, some uncertainty in detail. Generally unsettled next week too: showers affect most hills Monday and Tuesday, lowest cloud and most persistent rain along western slopes, but with some breaks as well with sunshine. Timing of most unsettled weather remains uncertain, but some risk of a deeper area of lower pressure from Wednesday or later brining widespread strong winds, probably gales over many summits, with prolonged heavy rain. Temperatures probably trending milder again into the weekend, pressure may begin to rise in the south, but this uncertain as well.
