

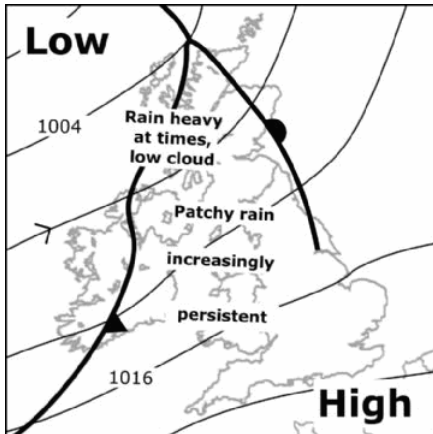
# Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Includes all summits in the the northern half of Wales from Pumlumon northwards.



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## General Summary for Sunday, 7 June, 2026



### British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 7 June, 2026

Scotland: Strong and gusty south-westerly winds will drive hill fog and frequent rainfall across western mountains, setting in during afternoon. Rainfall patchier across eastern hills with higher bases.  
 England and Wales: Windy with patchy light rain onto western hills, becoming more widely damp or wet through the day.

### Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Windy with low cloud and a little patchy rain. Becoming wetter in the afternoon.

## Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 7 June, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southwesterly 30-40mph, strong gusts over tops to 45mph, possibly stronger.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Walking strenuous, including lower slopes early, and often arduous over tops with considerable wind chill.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Drizzly rain west, will deteriorate</b> Some spotty rain drifting onto western slopes from time to time, perhaps a fine drizzle on high terrain in the early hours. More frequent and heavier rain developing from mid-afternoon.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Clinging to high west slopes</b> May be fairly extensive from middle slopes up in the morning, to the lower slopes west of high terrain. Lifting, likely largely above 700m, perhaps clearing summits of Berwyn group and Carneddau, but highest summits will struggle to clear.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>30%</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Weak sunshine through high cloud, but becoming overcast. Good visibility though a haze over the sea.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	7 or 8C, may rise to 9C Carneddau. Feeling near or below freezing in strongest wind.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

## Eryri / Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	Monday 8 June	Tuesday 9 June
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>  <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Southwesterly 15 to 25mph.  <b>Fairly small effect on walking, but feeling blustery and a noticeable chill on exposed high terrain.</b>	West to south-westerly 20 to 30mph, lifting to 35 to perhaps 40mph at times across the tops.  <b>Be prepared for very blustery conditions and a cold feel for the time of the year. Perhaps fairly arduous tops at times.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain then odd showers</b> A band of rain clears eastward around dawn, briefly heavy. Then a scattering of showers, risk some more frequent in west later.	<b>Frequent showers</b> Frequent precipitation through the day, in the form of shower after shower feeding in across the hills. Some hail mixed in with the risk of thunder inland.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>  <b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Often capping western tops</b>  Varied cloud banks often over western tops above 800m, some lower patches in showers. Some breaks to tops more often north and east Carneddau to Bala.  <b>30%</b>	<b>Frequently covering upper slopes</b>  Fairly extensive above 500-700m at first, but bases rising to become mostly around 700-900m afternoon, perhaps some breaks to tops, mainly well inland.  <b>30%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Brief bursts of sun. Visibility good away from showers and below cloud.	Often cloudy, patchy sun best in the east.  Visibility often poor due to rain.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	4 or 5C. Feeling below freezing directly in the wind.  Above the summits.	3C lifting to 5C  Above the summits

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 8 June, 2026**

The unsettled period of weather will persist over the coming week with low pressure area centres tracking just to the northwest of Scotland, allowing south-westerly winds to prevail. Rainfall often showery in nature, but coming in frequently to western mountains with the greatest falls for western Scotland. Chilly and windy at times; freezing level touching highest tops Scotland on Tuesday and Wednesday, when showers will fall as snow over the tops. Temperatures trending milder again next weekend, pressure may begin to rise in the south to give drier weather more widely.
