

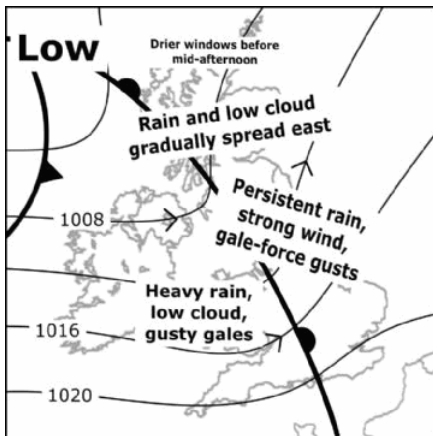
# Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

## General Summary for Thursday, 11 June, 2026



### British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 11 June, 2026

Persistent rain onto western hills from dawn, soon spreading widely. Murky with heavy falls, extended heavy falls west Wales. Very windy England and Wales, gale-force gusts, strongest Wales. Rain and strong wind slower to reach north and east Scotland though blanket low cloud fills in.

### Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Low cloud, persistent heavy rain; very windy, gales at times

## Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 11 June, 2026

<p><b>How windy? (On the summits)</b></p> <p><b>Effect of wind on you?</b></p>	<p>Southwesterly 25-30mph just at dawn, soon strengthening to 40-45mph by midday with powerful gusts approaching 55mph+ for several hours. Shifting westerly with afternoon speeds near 35-45mph, staying very gusty.</p> <p><b>Arduous walking conditions in exposure on high terrain all day with frequent buffeting; difficult conditions for several midday hours with wind knocking you off balance. Considerable wind chill.</b></p>
<p><b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)</p>	<p><b>Near-constant rain, extended heavy falls west</b></p> <p>Constant rain arriving from before dawn, some steadier heavier falls for periods through the morning. May break up a little in afternoon in north and eastern areas, but remaining persistent in the west with continued heavy falls.</p>
<p><b>Cloud on the hills?</b></p> <p><b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b></p>	<p><b>Extensive low cloud</b></p> <p>Blanket low cloud across the hills, to lower slopes west coast areas, highest bases northeast of Ogwen valley, but rarely above 600m.</p> <p><b>Practically nil</b></p>
<p><b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)</p>	<p>Overcast and dull, murky toward west.                  Poor visibility much of day in rain.</p>
<p><b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b></p> <p><b>Freezing Level</b></p>	<p>6C rising to 10C by evening and staying elevated into nighttime.                  Feeling like -3 to -6C directly in wind.</p> <p>Above the summits.</p>

## Eryri / Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	Friday 12 June	Saturday 13 June
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b> <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Westerly 25 to 35mph, strongest Snowdon/Yr Wyddfa range, at times 40mph. <b>Strenuous walking where exposed, buffeting gusts affecting balance on ridges. Feeling cool despite fairly mild air.</b>	Northwesterly 25-30mph at dawn, easing to 15-25mph most of the day, lightest wind later. <b>Walking may be strenuous with buffeting gusts and wind chill early, easing to fairly small effects.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Drizzly rain west</b> Damp over many western hills with drizzle often in the air, but may amount to little in total rainfall - some steadier light rain possible at times. Eastern hills drier, and perhaps more widely dry late in the day.	<b>Minimal patchy rain and drizzle</b> Damp with fine drizzle over the high tops with a few patches of rain drifting from the northwest from time to time. East Wales hills likely substantially dry.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Extensive, lowest west</b>  Persistent across the hills, foggy from lower elevations upward toward the west coast, cloud base rarely above 500m most western areas. Higher bases northeast of Ogwen and near Bala, but often shrouded above 600m.	<b>Lifting to high terrain</b>  Fairly extensive above 600-700m in the morning. A general lifting and breaking trend with time, though banks cling to terrain above 800-900m, and some variable lower banks on western slopes too.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>10%</b>	<b>50%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Largely cloudy, glimpses of sun mostly east Wales. Poor visibility, misty and hazy in west, locally better visibility below cloud in east.	A few glimpses of weak sunshine, most often cloudy to the west. Good visibility.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b> <b>Freezing Level</b>	9 or 10C, little change, but notably cooling overnight. Feeling like 0 to -3C where exposed to wind. Above the summits.	6C rising to 10C. Feeling below freezing in early direct wind. Above the summits.

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 12 June, 2026

Damp westerly breezes on Friday will cloak most mountains in cloud and some drizzle, better conditions eastwards. Cool and strong westerlies persist in Scotland on Saturday, then warmer with lighter winds by Sunday. Some patchy rain remaining in west and northwest Scotland over the weekend. Pressure tends to rise from the south this weekend, bringing warmer air and drier conditions to England & Wales, although west coast mountains may hold onto cloud. Into next week, a mixed southwesterly pattern remains, windy at times with periods of rain, drizzle and low cloud most persistent in the west. Warmest in England and Wales, but cooler westerly air likely returns at times mid-late week. Higher pressure then shows more signs of expanding over the country by late next week bringing improving conditions.

### Forecast issued at 15:56 on Wednesday, 10 June, 2026
