

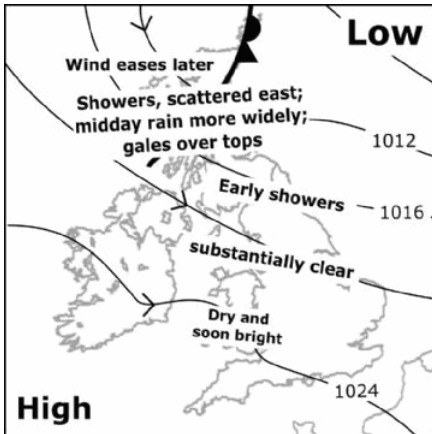
# Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

## General Summary for Saturday, 13 June, 2026



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 13 June, 2026**

Chilly and showery west Scottish highlands, fewer showers east but several afternoon hours of more widespread rain, later easing. Some early showers from south Scotland to north Wales, largely fading with sun breaks; south Wales is dry and brighter. Strong wind widely, easing Wales and north Scotland.

Blustery high tops early; early cloud and drizzle, improving

## Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 13 June, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Northwesterly 25-30mph at dawn, easing to 20-25mph most of the day, or as low as 15mph southernmost hills. A risk of occasional swathes of stronger wind spreading over northern hills.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Walking may be strenuous with buffeting gusts and wind chill early, easing to fairly small effects in most areas but momentary deteriorations in the north remain possible.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Any early light rain/drizzle soon fades</b> Damp with fine drizzle over the high tops with a few patches of rain drifting from the northwest in the early hours. East Wales hills dry, and likely widely dry by noon.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Lifting to high terrain, breaks forming with time</b> Fairly extensive above 600-700m in the morning. A general lifting and breaking trend with time, though banks cling to terrain above 800-900m, and some variable lower banks on western slopes too. Breaks to summits increasingly forming later, but always a risk of banks returning to high tops.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>30% rising to 60%</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Glimpses of sunshine, most often cloudy to the west. Good visibility but a light haze towards coasts.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	6C rising to 10C. Feeling below freezing in early direct wind.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>  <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Northwesterly 15mph at dawn, gusting 20-25mph over high tops and passes, easing and becoming variable, 10mph or  <b>Some notable gusts over high terrain just at and before dawn, but soon small.</b>	Low confidence: generally southerly 15-25mph, some risk stronger over high tops, and also chance of a morning lull.  <b>Probably fairly small, but a risk of stronger breezes impeding walking on high terrain.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>No rain expected</b>	<b>Showery rain, slowly clearing afternoon</b>  Showery rain through the morning, may set in for a few hours and a risk of some heavier falls. Rain begins to break through afternoon, but may be slow to clear.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>   <b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Patchy banks on high slopes, most north</b>  Variable banks of cloud above the mid-slopes at dawn, some thin mist in sheltered valleys as well; many slopes start clear. Cloud will lift to largely above 800m, mostly dissipating, but clinging to northern slopes for a few extra hours.  <b>Rising to 70%</b>	<b>Caps may cling to high summits</b>  Patchy banks of cloud early at various heights, mostly south/western slopes and many clear areas too. Bases lift to largely 900m and up, some breaks but caps may cling to high summits, and may fill in again for periods afternoon.  <b>Rising to 60%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Sun increasingly breaks out but probably weakened by high cloud. Very good visibility.	Often cloudy, a few glimpses of weak sun from time to time. Variable visibility, sometimes good but reduced in rain.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	7C rising to 12 or 13C; some chance that northernmost slopes stay cooler.  Above the summits.	9 to 11C; some uncertainty could be a degree warmer or cooler.  Well above the summits.

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 14 June, 2026

Sunday will be a clearing day for most under a core of high pressure: early rain in Scottish Highlands easing, most cloud lifting off all hills except the north of Scotland, and good sunshine through weakened by high cloud. Temperature more widely mild, warm in Wales. Into next week, a mixed southwesterly pattern remains, windy at times with periods of rain, drizzle and low cloud most persistent in the west. Warmest in England and Wales, but may stay cooler in Scotland as low pressure to the northwest recycles air from the north Atlantic back onto the Munros. Tuesday into Wednesday shows indications of a wetter and windier spell. Pressure generally trending higher later in the week, but extensively settled weather remains elusive until at least the following week.
