

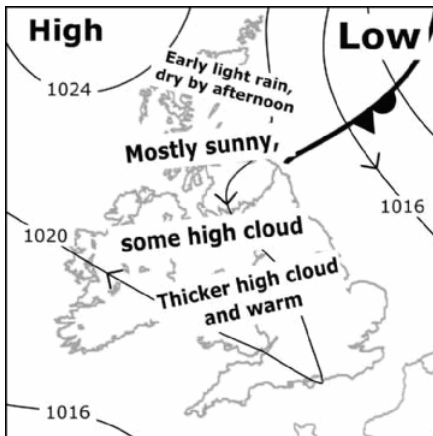
# Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Includes all summits in the the northern half of Wales from Pumlumon northwards.



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## General Summary for Sunday, 14 June, 2026



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 14 June, 2026**

Some early drizzle and patchy light rain in northern Scotland fades by afternoon. Elsewhere dry all day and often sunny though some high cloud weakening sun in places; sun may be more patchy east Scotland and later northern England. Warm southern Pennines and Wales. Light wind, though starting blustery in east Scotland.

### Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Weak sunshine, occasional thicker cloud, mild to warm

## Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 14 June, 2026

<p><b>How windy? (On the summits)</b></p> <p><b>Effect of wind on you?</b></p>	<p>Northwesterly 15mph at dawn, gusting 20-25mph over high tops and passes. Easing and shifting northerly, 10mph and often less through afternoon and direction often variable.</p> <p><b>Some notable gusts over high terrain just at and before dawn, but soon small.</b></p>
<p><b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)</p>	<p><b>No rain expected</b></p>
<p><b>Cloud on the hills?</b></p> <p><b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b></p>	<p><b>Likely largely clearing the summits by afternoon</b></p> <p>Variable banks of cloud above the mid-slopes at dawn, mostly northern areas and towards east Wales, some thin mist in sheltered valleys as well; many slopes start clear. Cloud will lift to above 800m, mostly dissipating, but clinging to northern slopes for a few extra hours.</p> <p><b>Rising to 80%</b></p>
<p><b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)</p>	<p>Sun increasingly breaks out but weakened by high cloud, and some moments of thicker high cloud too.</p> <p>Very good visibility.</p>
<p><b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b></p> <p><b>Freezing Level</b></p>	<p>6C rising to 11C. Hills south of Yr Wyddfa group likely a degree warmer.</p> <p>Above the summits.</p>

## Eryri / Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	Monday 15 June	Tuesday 16 June
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b> <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	South-southeasterly 15-25mph, notable gusts early, and may rise to sustained 30mph for a time afternoon. <b>Walking becoming impeded on high terrain, perhaps moments of strenuous walking during strongest gusts.</b>	Southwesterly 10-20mph dawn, strengthening to 30-40mph afternoon, several hours near higher end of range. <b>Fairly small at dawn, deteriorating to strenuous conditions, stability challenged over tops with considerable wind chill.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Some patchy rain, most often dry</b> A band of rain passes northeast through morning; precise timing uncertain and many hills may stay substantially dry. Afternoon is mostly dry, just a few light patchy falls possible.	<b>Patchy rain, later setting in</b> Patchy rain drifts from the southwest through morning, plenty of dry windows, but rain increasingly frequent afternoon, first towards mid-Wales, then more widely persistent across the west into evening.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Caps may cling to high summits</b>  Patchy banks of cloud early at various heights, mostly south/western slopes and many clear areas too. Bases lift to largely 900m and up, some breaks but caps may cling to high summits, and may fill in again for periods afternoon.	<b>Fairly extensive, some early breaks</b>  High terrain shrouded from dawn, likely 500-600m upward; some morning periods of higher bases, any breaks to summits brief. Then more extensively shrouded afternoon from 400m up, higher bases north of the A5.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Rising to 60%</b>	<b>20%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Often cloudy, a few glimpses of weak sun from time to time. Variable visibility, sometimes good but reduced in rain.	Mostly overcast, rare glimpses of weak sun early. Very good visibility below cloud, deteriorating later in rain.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	10 to 12C; some uncertainty, could be a degree cooler.  Well above the summits.	10 or 11C. Feeling near freezing in strongest wind.  Above the summits.

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 15 June, 2026

Through Monday, cloud will return from the southwest and bring some patchy rain with it. From Tuesday onward, a variable southwesterly will dominate through at least mid-week. Windy at times with periods of rain, drizzle and low cloud most persistent in the west; Tuesday into Wednesday is likely a wetter and unsettled period, with the unsettled weather lingering well into Wednesday in Scotland. Warmest in England and Wales, but may stay cooler in Scotland as low pressure to the northwest recycles air from the north Atlantic back onto the Munros. Pressure generally trending higher later in the week, centred southeast of England, but low pressure to the west of Ireland will prevent any extended settled periods with more windy, wet weather at times next weekend; temperatures likely become more widely warm.
