

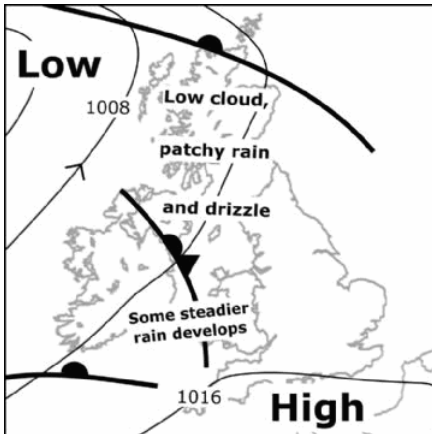
# Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

## General Summary for Tuesday, 16 June, 2026



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 16 June, 2026**

Damp southerly air will cloak many hills in low cloud, plus drizzle or a little rain. Highest cloud bases and best chance for breaks further northward. Moderate winds, more blustery near west coasts, strengthening for Wales where frequent rain arriving.

### Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Breezy, increasingly windy. Low cloud, rain mainly afternoon.

## Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 16 June, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	South-southwesterly 15-20mph from dawn into morning, strengthening to 30mph midday onward, some stronger gusts high tops, in places 40mph later.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Fairly small at dawn, becoming more blustery, affecting comfortable walking on high terrain, gusts making balance more challenging on some exposed ridges. Marked wind chill despite mild air.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Patchy rain develops into afternoon</b> Largely dry morning, some patchy light rain drifts from the southwest. Rain increasingly frequent afternoon, more persistent western hills, some heavier pulses of rain occasionally. Risk more constant rain later evening, mainly southern areas.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Fairly extensive, some breaks north and east</b> High terrain shrouded from dawn, likely 500-600m upward; some morning periods of higher bases, any breaks to summits brief, best chance over Carneddau and near Bala to Berwyn groups. Then more extensively shrouded from the west in afternoon, from 400m up near west coast, higher bases north of the A5.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>20%</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Mostly overcast, rare glimpses of weak sun mainly north and eastern areas. Very good visibility below cloud, deteriorating later in rain.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	10 or 11C. Feeling near freezing in strongest wind.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

## Eryri / Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	Wednesday 17 June	Thursday 18 June
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b> <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Southwesterly 25 to 35mph, gusty around higher tops, some passes, also downslopes to the northeast. <b>Blustery over the hills, strenuous walking in exposure on higher slopes, starting to affect balance on some ridges.</b>	South-southwesterly, tending to strengthen possibly soon, 25mph to 35-40mph, risk reaching 50mph later at least in gusts. <b>Expect strenuous walking conditions over the hills, gusts making balance increasingly challenging in exposure.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain and drizzle, fading</b> A mix of rain, drizzle and some showery moments; the most frequent rain typically western hills, risk persistently wet over several hours. Tending to fade through afternoon.	<b>Rain and drizzle much of day</b> Generally damp at best, risk some more persistent steady or heavier rain over western mountains. Patchier rain eastwards.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Extensive, some improvement afternoon</b> Blanket cloud across the hills around rain, from lower slopes upward toward Cardigan Bay and Llyn Peninsula, here may persist over tops all day. Lifting to 600m near & northeast of the A5, some breaks form higher in afternoon.	<b>Extensive, lowest west</b> Shrouding the hills throughout the day, from lower slopes up toward west coasts, rarely above 500-600m inland, but some higher breaks Carneddau and Berwyn hills.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>20%</b>	<b>10%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Largely cloudy, some sun may break through afternoon mainly north/east. Hazy much of day near west coast, misty widely around rain, then visibility improves afternoon, to be very good well inland.	Largely cloudy, dull. Misty to lower levels near Cardigan Bay, local better visibility below cloud north and east.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b> <b>Freezing Level</b>	10C, little change all day. Feeling near to freezing directly in wind.  Above the summits.	10C rising to 12C, locally warmer northeastern areas afternoon. Feeling near 0C directly in wind on tops. Above the summits.

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 17 June, 2026

Humid southwesterly winds continue to prevail later this week, likely reaching gale-force over hills for a period Thursday into Friday, soonest in Wales. Periods of rain, some heavy, mixed with drizzle and low cloud most persistent in the west. More uncertainty of day-to-day detail in the extended range, but in general a variable southwesterly pattern continues; rain and low cloud common in western Scotland into next week. Some warmer days, drier more often England and Wales.
