

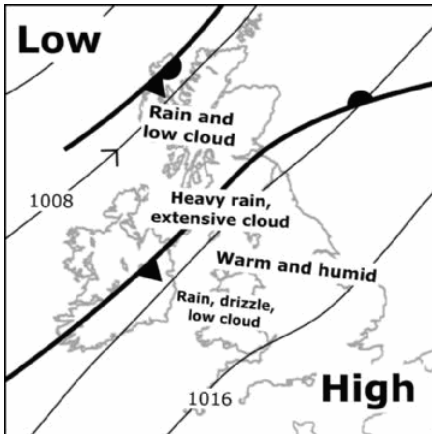

General Summary for Thursday, 18 June, 2026



British Mountain Summary:
Based on forecast chart for noon 18 June, 2026

Rain and low cloud affects many mountains, most persistent in the west, patchier and lighter for the Highlands by afternoon. A band of heavier rain for northern England and southwest Scotland, risk some thundery bursts. Blustery southwesterly winds. Feeling humid particularly for England and Wales.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Windy, up to gale-force. Rain and lowest cloud west.

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 18 June, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	South-southwesterly, soon strengthening from dawn, 25 to 35-40mph, some gusts 50mph for a time western tops, fluctuating during afternoon, but sustained strong winds persist. Rising into night to 40-50mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Strenuous walking conditions over the hills, gusts making balance challenging in exposure. Marked wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain and drizzle, most in northwest Generally damp in west, some more persistent steady or heavier rain for periods over western mountains around Snowdon / Yr Wyddfa to Llyn Peninsula. Patchier rain east and southwards, locally often dry.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive, lowest west Shrouding the hills throughout the day, from lower slopes up toward west coasts, rarely above 500-600m inland, but some higher breaks Carneddau and Berwyn hills.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Below 10% west, 20% furthest north/east
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Largely cloudy, dull. Misty to lower levels near Cardigan Bay, local better visibility below cloud north and east.
How Cold? (at 900m)	10C rising to 12C, locally warmer northeastern areas afternoon, quite humid. Feeling like 0C directly in wind on tops.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Eryri / Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	Friday 19 June	Saturday 20 June
How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	South-southwesterly, 40 to 50mph all day, peak gusts vary, over 60mph for periods around high tops, may lessen later. Challenging walking, gusts knocking you off balance, including on some downslopes to north. Considerable wind chill.	Southwesterly 20mph, easing a little during day. Fairly small, but feeling breezy and rather cool on high tops at least in morning.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Risk thundery bursts developing Early patchy rain in west, or spots from high cloud inland, but several hours likely largely dry. Increasing risk with time of heavy bursts of rain forming, possibly torrential. Risk of thunder.	Early light showers fade Drizzly showers mostly west coastal hills early in day, fading to become dry.
Cloud on the hills?	Varied, most persistent west coast Covering many hills from dawn, to lower slopes near Cardigan Bay, here likely to persist. Some rise of base inland and north, some breaks. Filling in and lowering in rain widely, ragged low patches.	Lowest in west and in morning Covering western hills fairly widely in morning, to lower slopes toward coast. Bases rising, tending to thin and break, but patches still likely to cap tops in Snowdon group into afternoon, may gradually clear.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20% west, 50% north/east.	20% rising to 70% afternoon
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Any sun weak through high cloud, mostly north & east; largely overcast west. Visibility may be good for a time inland, but a haze, then murkier around rain.	Misty and largely cloudy start, improving with some sun breaking through and visibility becoming very good below cloud.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	Humid 12 to 14C, tending to drop later in day, by evening-night to 7C. Feeling near freezing in wind all day. Above the summits.	7C rising to 9 or 10C afternoon. Feeling near to freezing in wind on higher tops in the morning. Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 19 June, 2026

Humid southwesterly winds, gales across many mountains on Friday, plus heavy rain, thundery bursts mixed in. Less windy, but still breezy into Saturday in Scotland, feeling less humid for most, but western Scottish hills at least stay cloud capped and with showery rain. Sunday is a drier day with clearer hills, light winds and feeling warmer. Into next week, a mixed west-southwesterly pattern for Scotland, rain and low cloud most common in the west, drier with higher cloud eastwards and more often dry. Warm and humid for England & Wales - often dry, but possible thunderstorms forming at times - detail more uncertain.
