

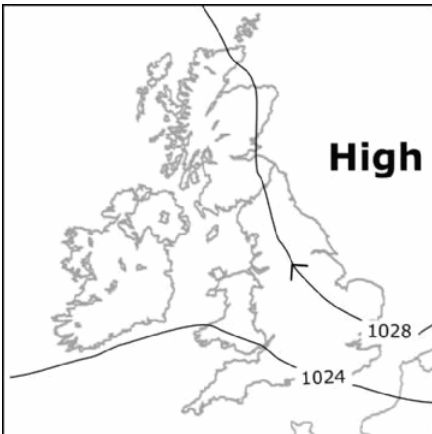
Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

General Summary for Monday, 22 June, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 22 June, 2026

Although high pressure will dominate - bringing high temperatures and sunshine to Wales and most of England, in the far north and across Scotland, high level cloud may bring rain for an hour or two, this leading to formation of low cloud that may be very slow to lift.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Light wind; chance of a little rain. Sunshine; very warm and humid.

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 22 June, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	South to southeasterly between 10mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Risk of the odd shower but extensively dry Here and there a burst of rain.
Cloud on the hills?	Very little for most of the day - may form in rain. Generally the hills free of cloud although fog possible temporarily on higher slopes in rain.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Greater than 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive sunshine. Visibility good, although a haze.
How Cold? (at 900m)	17 rising to 20C - very warm and also very humid indeed.
Freezing Level	Above the summits

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly 15mph or less.	Direction may well vary, 10mph or less.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible	Negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain very unlikely	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Little if any	Little if any Risk fog lowest coastal slopes/cliffs at times. The hills fog free.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Soon almost certain	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine extensive, sometimes weak due to thin high level cloud. Good visibility although hazy.	Extensive sunshine. Persistent haze.
How Cold? (at 900m)	18C rising to a very warm (and exceptionally humid) 21C.	21C rising toward an exceptionally hot 22 to perhaps 26C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 23 June, 2026**

A few days of often sunny and very warm weather. Some doubt remains about daytime temperatures - these possibly exceptionally hot on Wednesday (England and Wales) and Thursday (everywhere). The range in mountain temperatures given on Wednesday's forecasts reflects the uncertainty. Gradually less hot Friday and into the weekend; the change accompanied by thunderstorms in some areas.

Forecast issued at 14:22 on Sunday, 21 June, 2026
