

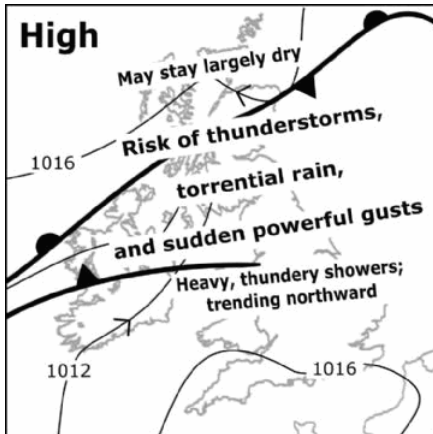

General Summary for Friday, 26 June, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 26 June, 2026

Starting hot and humid again, a cooling trend afternoon. Thundery showers for many in the morning, tending to clear in Wales. Afternoon thunderstorms and torrential rain in north England and Scotland, risk of localised flash flooding near heaviest downpours. Driest south Wales and Northwest Highlands.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Risk thundery showers; cooling afternoon, likely dry later

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 26 June, 2026

<p>How windy? (On the summits)</p> <p>Effect of wind on you?</p>	<p>South-southwesterly 20-25mph, perhaps lighter in the morning, but always gusty around showers, particularly if thundery, and a strengthening trend, 30-35mph over tops later in the day.</p> <p>Affecting ease of walking in exposure most of the day, buffeting gusts will be common, and walking likely increasingly strenuous as evening approaches.</p>
<p>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</p>	<p>Bursts of rain, risk of thunder, an easing tendency afternoon</p> <p>From before dawn, risk scattered bursts of heavy rain or thunderstorms. Risk tends to ease through afternoon, though east Wales may continue to see rain for a time.</p>
<p>Cloud on the hills?</p> <p>Chance of cloud free summits?</p>	<p>May becoming fairly extensive south and west</p> <p>Mountains may start substantially clear, odd ragged patches here and there, thicker near rain. With time, banks increasingly forming from 500m up at varied heights (summits may be out of cloud at times), mostly affecting slopes toward Cardigan Bay; Carneddau/east Wales may remain clear.</p> <p>50%</p>
<p>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</p>	<p>Patchy sunshine, some high cloud around more extensive sun north and east later with less high cloud.</p> <p>Visibility improves after morning haze lifts.</p>
<p>How Cold? (at 900m)</p> <p>Freezing Level</p>	<p>Starting at an exceptionally hot and humid 22 to 24C from overnight. Cooling through the day, finishing near 15 to 17C, coolest towards Cardigan Bay; Carneddau and east Wales slower to cool.</p> <p>Above the summits.</p>

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Southerly, some uncertainty of peak speed, in range 30mph to possibly 50mph, at least in gusts around Snowdon Expect strenuous walking conditions, more challenging in places with buffeting gusts knocking you off balance.	Southwesterly 20-25mph, sometimes gusting 30mph over high terrain, may reach sustained 30mph later. Fairly small, but gust impact ease of walking, perhaps more consistently impeded high terrain later in the day.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Bursts of rain, risk thunder High uncertainty of detail, but expect clusters of heavy showery rain tracking northeastward throughout the day. Lengthy drier windows possible, but risk sudden downpours, thunder and lightning.	Morning rain, substantially dry afternoon From before dawn, several bands of rain pass west-to-east, brief heavier falls likely in the morning. From midday onward, largely dry, some risk of light spots of rain drifting onto western hills.
Cloud on the hills?	Varied, mostly west and in rain Varied cloud banks, most frequent over west coastal slopes. Some patches lower down inland in morning. Breaks to tops more often north and east. In rain, banks lower and fill in, ragged low patches.	Lifting and breaking trend afternoon Fairly extensive through much of morning, to most middle slopes, or lower western slopes with ragged patches to forest canopies in the early morning. From noon, a rising and breaking trend, to banks above 800m with some breaks.
Chance of cloud free summits?	40%	20%, rising afternoon to 50%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of sun, but high cloud covering sky for periods. Some mistiness in morning. Visibility often good, but occasionally poor in rain.	Mostly cloudy morning breaking into a patchwork of cloud and sun afternoon. Visibility becoming very good.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	14 or 15C, small variation all day. Still rather humid. Feeling cooler directly in wind. Above the summits.	10 or 11C, may cool slightly later afternoon. Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 27 June, 2026**

The transition away from the exceptionally hot and humid weather begins on Saturday as wind shifts southwesterly and strengthens. Rain and thunderstorms may continue on Saturday as well as perhaps early Sunday, but a front will push east across the country on Sunday, followed by fresher, sunnier weather; patchy rain will likely linger here and there, notably northwest Scotland.

Westerly Atlantic patterns dominate next week: high pressure south and low pressure north will bring alternating settled and unsettled windows. Wind generally on the strong side, mild to sometimes warm temperatures, and periods of rain punctuated by bright sunshine. North and western areas most vulnerable to extensive cloud and prolonged rain.
