

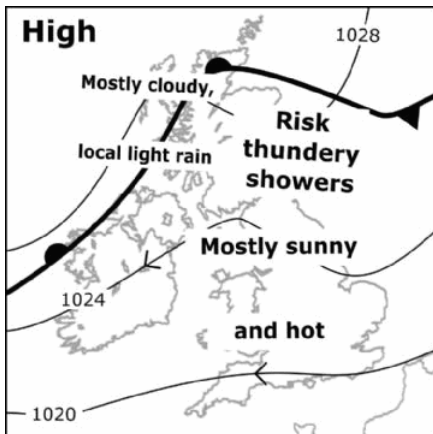
Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

General Summary for Saturday, 11 July, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 11 July, 2026

Fairly cloudy Scottish highlands, drizzly tops east where a risk of thundery showers; drier west, local bright breaks. A rising risk of heavy/thundery showers forming over Southern Uplands. Very warm and sunny in England, but high cloud and a risk of showers far north later. Extensive hot sunshine for Wales.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Extensive hot sunshine, risk sunburn and dehydration

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 11 July, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	At dawn, variable less than 10mph over Eryri/Snowdonia NP. Further south, easterly 10mph, gradually trending east-northeasterly widely and strengthening, finishing at 15-20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Small most of the day, but the breeze will pick up over the tops later in the day.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Hills clear
Chance of cloud free summits?	Nearly certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive sunshine, some thin high cloud, patchy fair weather cloud around in the morning and afternoon. Some early haze but visibility improves to very good.
How Cold? (at 900m)	19C rising to 22C, warmest south and east, a degree higher towards Penygader (valleys approaching 27C, warmer east Wales).
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

	Sunday 12 July	Monday 13 July
How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Easterly 25-35mph morning and quite gusty. Easing tendency afternoon, mostly 20-30mph, but staying gusty. Strenuous walking over tops at times, particularly early with buffeting gusts starting to affect stability.	Easterly 20-25mph. Quite gusty over tops, pushing downslope early with max speeds approaching 35mph at times. Comfort of walking affected on tops, more strenuous early with frequent nuisance gusts.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Likely dry Small chance of some patchy rain drifting onto northern slopes in the morning, but the hills more likely entirely dry.	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Hills soon clear Scattered ribbons of cloud on east Wales slopes between 500-800m, a few banks into Eryri/Snowdonia NP as well, but these soon thinning and dissipating.	Likely none A few ribbons of cloud affecting some middle slopes towards east Wales, these very sparse and soon thinning and dissipating for clear hills.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Above 90%	Above 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly sunny, some thin high cloud. Good visibility, a light haze.	Extensive sunshine. Good visibility, a light haze.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	15 to 17C, mildest over Carneddau; a degree warmer near Penygader (where valley temperatures approach 26C). Above the summits.	16C rising to 19C, western valleys approaching 27C; less humid than recent days. Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 12 July, 2026**

Staying very warm late weekend into next week. High pressure north of the country keeps the skies mostly clear and facilitates an easterly flow, pushing the warmest temperatures to western hill groups. Northeastern areas will see early sea fog under the high pressure, this dissipating in the sun through morning. Scottish highlands seeing temperatures often rise into the mid-teens, valley temperatures to the 20s west; warmest Wales where hill temperatures often to 20C or higher. A fairly sustained breeze most of the week in England and Wales, at times stronger and quite gusty. Low pressure south of the country may push cloud and showers into Wales, though confidence remains low, and could remain largely dry. Detail uncertain later next week, but a milder northerly flow may begin to establish.
