

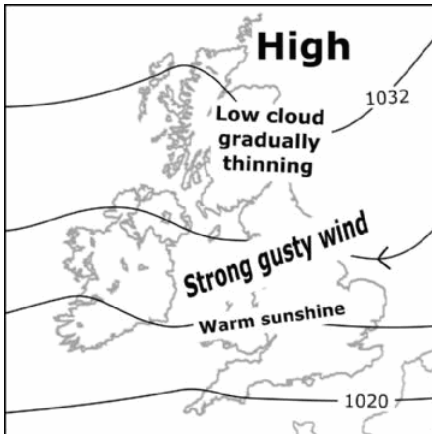
Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

General Summary for Sunday, 12 July, 2026



British Mountain Summary:
Based on forecast chart for noon 12 July, 2026

Cloud shrouds many hills in Scotland and NE England in the morning, more broken westwards; slowly tending to thin to leave patchier cloud on higher tops mainly eastern Scotland by afternoon. A notably strong gusty easterly wind for England & Wales, but mostly sunny. Warm for Wales & Peak District.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Strong wind, gusty. Warm sunshine.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 12 July, 2026

| How windy? (On the summits) | Easterly 25 to 35mph, strongest in morning and quite gusty. Easing a little afternoon, mostly 20-30mph, but staying gusty, and tending to increase again during evening, to 30-35mph, risk gusts 40mph mid-Wales. |
| Effect of wind on you? | Strenuous walking over tops at times, particularly early and late with buffeting gusts starting to affect stability over high terrain and especially exposed ridges. |
| How wet? (Precipitation and its impact) | No rain expected |
| Cloud on the hills? | Hills largely clear Scattered ribbons of cloud at first on east Wales slopes between 500-800m, a few banks into Eryri/Snowdonia NP as well, but these soon thinning and dissipating. |
| Chance of cloud free summits? | Above 90% |
| Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud) | Mostly sunny, some thin high cloud. Good visibility, a light haze. High UV, beware sunburn. |
| How Cold? (at 900m) | 15 to 18C, tops warmer than some lower slopes at first; rising a degree or so warmer mid-Wales. (Valley temperatures reach 25 to 28C). |
| Freezing Level | Above the summits. |

| How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you? | Easterly 20-25mph. Quite gusty over tops, pushing downslope early with max speeds approaching 35mph at times. Comfort of walking affected on tops, more strenuous early with frequent nuisance gusts. | Easterly 25mph, but some gusty spots 35mph around upper slopes, strongest speeds not necessarily on summits. Breezy over the hills, gusty areas making walking uncomfortable and affecting balance on ridges; feeling cooler. |
| How wet? (Precipitation and its impact) | No rain expected | No rain expected |
| Cloud on the hills? | Likely none A few ribbons of cloud affecting some middle slopes towards east Wales, these very sparse and soon thinning and dissipating for clear hills. | Early cloud in east clearing Cloud banks over some hills, Bala, Berwyn and Carneddau areas from dawn, mostly above 400-500m; very highest tops may be just above cloud. Patchy or very little toward the west. Soon largely dispersing. |
| Chance of cloud free summits? | Above 90% | 50% east early, otherwise above 90% |
| Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud) | Extensive sunshine. Good visibility, a light haze. | Mostly sunny west, some patchy cloud in east early in day. Visibility largely very good. |
| How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level | 16C rising to 19C, (western valleys approaching 27C); less humid than recent days. Above the summits. | 12 to 15C from dawn, coolest if in cloud, rising to 17C (valleys rising to 25C or locally warmer afternoon). Above the summits. |

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 13 July, 2026**

A fine week of summer weather - warm and dry with pleasantly warm temperatures and often plenty of sunshine. High pressure north of the country keeps the skies mostly clear, some low-level cloud rolling inland from the North Sea at times. A prevailing easterly flow, pushing the warmest temperatures to western hill groups, valley temperatures often 25C, or warmer for Wales and Peak District, at times 30C. A fairly sustained breeze most of the week in England and Wales, at times stronger and quite gusty. Notably dry ground conditions, beware very high fire risk. Later in the week, an increasing risk of thundery showers forming, with a cooling trend into the weekend 18-19th.
