

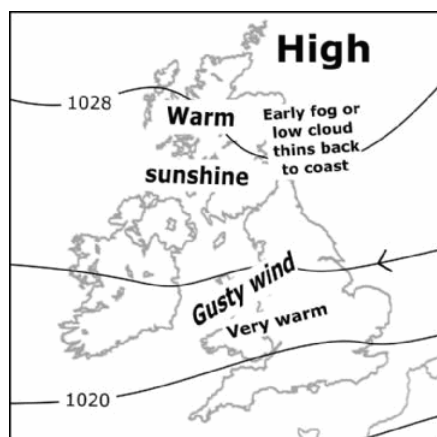
Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

General Summary for Tuesday, 14 July, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 14 July, 2026

Dry with strong sunshine, warmest in west.

Early fog and low cloud over eastern hills retreats toward the North Sea in the morning. Gusty easterlies mainly central Scotland southwards, strongest for Wales.

Extremely dry ground conditions - beware high risk of fire.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Strong gusty wind, warm sunshine, early patchy cloud east.

Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 14 July, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Easterly 25mph, but some gusty spots 35mph around upper slopes, strongest gusts not necessarily on summits; speeds lessen a little afternoon, may rise slightly again up to dusk.
Effect of wind on you?	Breezy over the hills, gusty areas making walking uncomfortable and affecting balance on ridges; feeling cooler where exposed.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Little if any Patchy cloud over some eastern hills from dawn, mainly Bala and Berwyn areas, above 500-600m; very highest tops may be just above cloud. Very little if any elsewhere. Soon largely dispersing.
Chance of cloud free summits?	70% at first east, otherwise practically certain.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly sunny west, some patchy cloud in east early in day and a little fair-weather cloud builds during day. Visibility very good, some haze locally. High UV, beware sunburn.
How Cold? (at 900m)	12 to 15C from dawn, coolest if in cloud in east, rising to 18 or 19C (valleys reach 27 to local 29C afternoon). Directly in the wind will feel fresher, but beware dehydration.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

	Wednesday 15 July	Thursday 16 July
How windy? (On the summits)	Easterly 20 to 25mph, some gusty spots 35mph around higher mountains, passes and downslope to west in morning.	Easterly 15-20mph, some gusty areas at times 25-30mph, not just on the highest terrain.
Effect of wind on you?	Feeling breezy over the hills, gusty areas starting to affect comfortable walking and balance at times.	Fairly small, but some more gustier locations may make walking uncomfortable through high passes and some slopes.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Little if any From dawn, some patchy cloud around 500-600m mainly Berwyn to Bala hills, some high tops above this cloud, soon all thinning and dispersing. Brief fragments in west, but largely clear.	Hills clear Any patchy cloud on easternmost hills at first soon dispersing.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Soon practically certain	Practically certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Strong sunshine most of the day, a little thin fair-weather cloud. Visibility excellent, some early haze.	Sunshine over the hills dawn til dusk, occasional thin high cloud. Visibility excellent.
How Cold? (at 900m)	15C from dawn (cooler on some eastern hills if in cloud), rising to 18C afternoon (valleys reaching 27C).	15C from dawn (warmer than valleys at first), rising to 18C (valleys reach 27C).
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 15 July, 2026

Staying broadly fine likely through the weekend into early next week at least - dry with pleasantly warm temperatures and often plenty of sunshine. Some coastal fog rolling inland overnight for misty dawns in places this week.

Valley temperatures rising to 25C or above, typically warmer in Wales and Peak District. Gusty easterly winds for England and Wales. An ongoing very high risk of fire with extremely dry ground conditions. Into the weekend, northerly breezes develop more widely, a cooling trend for a time, particularly Scotland where summit temperatures likely dip back below 10C; some cloud may be drawn onto northern mountains at times, small chance of isolated showers.
