

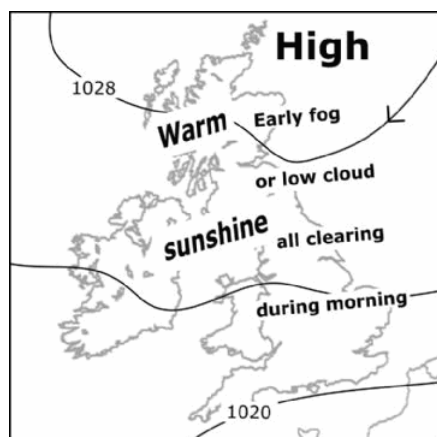

General Summary for Wednesday, 15 July, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 15 July, 2026

Warm across the hills with strong sunshine. Fog for lower eastern areas from dawn - Scottish hills above the fog, whilst low cloud banks drift onto hill slopes over Pennines for a few hours. Easterly breeze, strongest for south Pennines & Wales. Extremely dry ground, beware of fire.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Warm and sunny. Gusty breeze.

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 15 July, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Easterly 20mph, some gusty spots 30mph around higher mountains, passes and downslope mainly to west of hills toward mid-Wales in morning.
Effect of wind on you?	Feeling breezy over the hills, gusty areas occasionally starting to affect comfortable walking.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Early patches east clear; little if any west From dawn, some patchy cloud around 500-600m mainly Berwyn to Bala hills, some high tops 600-700m upward above this cloud, soon all thinning and dispersing. Brief fragments in west, but largely clear.
Chance of cloud free summits?	50% at first furthest east, otherwise practically certain.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Strong sunshine most of the day, a little thin fair-weather cloud. Visibility excellent, some early haze.
How Cold? (at 900m)	16C from dawn (cooler on some eastern hills if in cloud), rising to 19C afternoon (valleys reaching 26 to 28C).
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

	Thursday 16 July	Friday 17 July
How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Easterly, later northeasterly; 15-20mph, some gusty areas 25mph mainly early and late in the day. Fairly small, but some more noticeable gustier spots at times.	North to northeasterly 10 to 20mph, strongest over tops in Snowdon/Yr Wyddfa area and on Llyn peninsula. Mostly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Hills clear Any patchy cloud on easternmost hills at first soon dispersing.	Hills clear Chance of an odd patch of cloud drifting onto northern slopes.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Practically certain	Above 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine over the hills dawn til dusk, occasional thin high cloud. Visibility excellent.	Sunshine and thin high cloud. Visibility very good, slight low-level haze.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	15C from dawn (warmer than valleys at first), rising to 18C (valleys reach 27C). Above the summits.	15C from dawn, small rise to 17C. Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 16 July, 2026

Settled summer weather continues into the weekend and next week as high pressure dominates. Warm temperatures on the hills in midweek will trend cooler from the north from Friday into the weekend, dropping below 10C on summits for periods, mainly Scottish mountains. Most persistently cooler in the north where some cloud will be drawn over the tops at times, occasional light showery rain. Otherwise generally ongoing dry weather, with good amounts of sun and many hill tops often clear of cloud. Continuing very high risk of fire with extremely dry ground conditions. A change of weather pattern late in the month brings scope for rain and thundery showers.
