

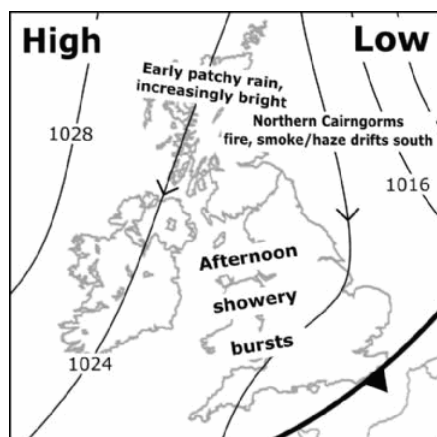

General Summary for Saturday, 18 July, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 18 July, 2026

Fog and patchy light rain north Scottish highlands early, breaking for a dry bright afternoon; smokey views east Scotland. Warm and dry with widespread high fire risk. Sun and fair weather cloud England and Wales, afternoon scattered showery bursts from Yorks Dales NP southward to Wales.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Risk afternoon showers, trending southward

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 18 July, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Northerly, some variability, 10-20mph, gusty early. A northeasterly trend later, trending towards the higher end of the range.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, some nuisance gusts, and walking increasingly inconvenienced into evening.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rising chance of showers mid-Wales afternoon Largely dry well into the day, a rising chance of showers through afternoon, risk of local heavy bursts. The showers will trend southward, Eryri/Snowdonia NP perhaps entirely dry.
Cloud on the hills?	Passing banks on tops Varied patchy mist on middle and low slopes early, many hills start clear. Mist lifting and mostly dissipating soon after dawn. Cloud banks forming at and above 800m from time to time over Eryri/Snowdonia NP, but cloud regularly above the tops as well, and clearest late in the day.
Chance of cloud free summits?	80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	A patchwork of cloud and sunshine, perhaps more widely sunny to the north later in the day. A light haze tends to fade, visibility becomes good.
How Cold? (at 900m)	12 to 14C, coolest Carneddau to Llanberis where little or no rise in temperature; valleys rising to 18C, warmer east Wales.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

How windy? (On the summits)	North-northeasterly 5-15mph.	Northerly 5-15mph; both speed and direction somewhat variable.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small.	Mostly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Likely dry Small chance of a few sprinkles on slopes near coasts in the afternoon, more likely entirely dry.	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Hills clear Chance some light mist in sheltered areas in the morning, this fading but also some cloud banks lifting to the high tops; plenty of clear spells expected.	Early mist, some banks on high tops Some early patchy mist in valleys, this soon fading but variable cloud banks form on higher terrain as the northerly wind becomes steadier. With time, banks isolate to high summits with breaks.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%	Rising to 70%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Often sunny, some thin high cloud and fair weather cloud developing; sunniest to the north. Excellent visibility.	Often sunny, some fair weather cloud building, cloudiest on upper northern terrain. Very good visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m)	10C rising to 13C Eryri/Snowdonia NP, least rise north slopes; may be a degree warmer to the south and east.	11C rising to 14C, or milder well-inland.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 19 July, 2026

Ground conditions remain very dry with wildfire risk; some areas in north Wales, the Peak District, and Cairngorms NP are currently inaccessible due to fire hazards. Weather remains settled late weekend into next week as high pressure persists west of Ireland. A northerly flow will cool temperatures slightly, dawn temperatures in the middle single digits in Scotland; staying warm in England and Wales but hill temperatures unlikely reaching the 20s. Cloud and drizzle starts to affect northwest Scotland more often, occasionally drifting further south, chance of an area of rain slipping south through the country Tuesday to Wednesday, though totals likely small. An unsettling trend is indicated for the following weekend, bringing wind, some rain, and cooler temperatures.
