

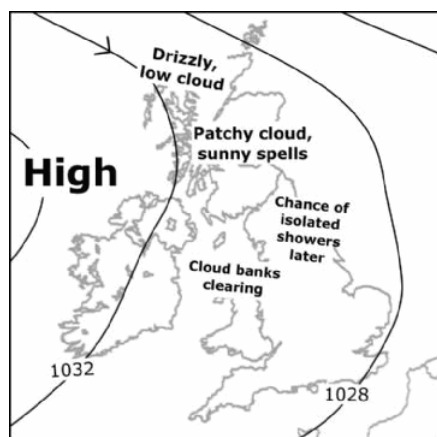

General Summary for Tuesday, 21 July, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 21 July, 2026

Breezy over northern Scottish mountains, tending to strengthen; fairly light wind elsewhere. Most places dry with some patchy cloud on tops largely clearing. Feeling warm in the sun. Northwest Highland coasts hold low cloud and some drizzle much of day. Chance of a late shower over the Pennines.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Patchy cloud clearing, some sun; light winds until late.

Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 21 July, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Northwesterly 5 to 15mph, increasing a little during day, reaching 20-25mph high tops during evening and into night, soonest over more western summits.
Effect of wind on you?	Small most of the day, becoming breezier over hills later, feeling blustery toward sunset western tops.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Largely dry Chance of an odd brief patch of drizzle northern hills in the morning.
Cloud on the hills?	Mostly north in morning, clearing Patchy cloud banks grazing higher tops mainly in the Snowdon/Yr Wyddfa group for periods in the morning. Lifting to be well broken above tops into afternoon.
Chance of cloud free summits?	50% rising to 90% afternoon
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of cloud and sun, sunshine best near coast in afternoon. Visibility very good.
How Cold? (at 900m)	12C, small change northwestern areas, rising to 15C toward mid-Wales tops.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Eryri / Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	Wednesday 22 July	Thursday 23 July
How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	North to northwesterly 15 to 25mph, some gusts 30mph higher tops in northern areas. Feeling breezy and quite cool over higher terrain, starting to affect ease of walking and balance on exposed high ridges.	Northwesterly 10 to 15mph, often less toward mid-Wales. Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Damp start toward north Drizzle and a little light rain briefly over northern hills in the morning, largely fading into middle of day, but an odd light shower possible inland in the afternoon.	Generally dry Small chance a brief light shower mainly afternoon.
Cloud on the hills?	Early low cloud lifting and clearing Cloud banks early morning most widely over northern hills, possibly to 500-600m for a time, 700m and more broken further south; highest tops may be near top of cloud sheet. Rising to 800-900m then increasingly breaking during day.	Patchy cloud lifting and breaking Local mist in valleys, patchy cloud banks from dawn, soon mostly above 700m. Cloud base rising toward then above most higher summits by midday, odd patches above 900-1000m.
Chance of cloud free summits?	50% rising to 90%	60% rising to 80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Fairly cloudy, some sun breaking through, best mid-Wales. Visibility reduced around early dampness, then very good below cloud.	Patchwork of cloud and sun, best toward the coast in the afternoon. Visibility very good.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	10C rising to 13C. Feeling like 3 to 5C directly in the wind on high tops. Above the summits.	12C, little change all day Yr Wyddfa / Snowdon group, rising to 16C mid-Wales. Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 22 July, 2026

Largely dry weather continues this week as high pressure stays nearby. Very dry ground and high fire risk, beware of some ongoing fire management with locally restricted access to hills. A prevailing northwesterly wind brings further low cloud and some drizzle onto northwestern Scottish mountains - more widely across the western Highlands later in the week as the flow turns more westerly, with occasional steadier light rain. Patchy cloud over tops elsewhere, best sunshine and warmth in east and south-facing areas. Westerly winds strengthen everywhere into the weekend, bringing some rain and showers to all regions. A changeable and cooler outlook is expected into the last week of July.
