

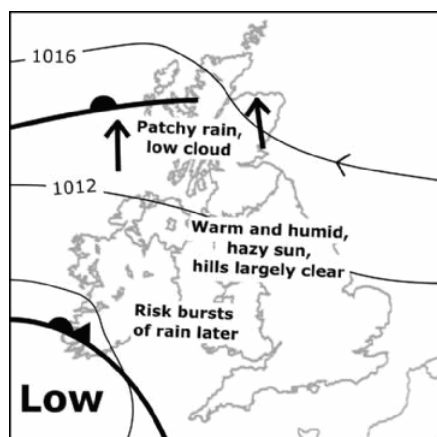

General Summary for Monday, 3 August, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 3 August, 2026

Some rain drifts north across Scotland, with low cloud banks mostly on south-facing hill groups. A gusty east-southeasterly wind all day England & Wales, and strengthens with time across the Highlands. Humid with warm sun and thin high cloud for England & Wales, later risk of rain in west.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Gusty wind. Largely dry until late, hazy sun, warm and humid.

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 3 August, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Southeasterly 20 to 30mph, gusts 35mph at times some slopes, a little less during afternoon, then increasing again into the evening.
Effect of wind on you?	Blustery, gusty in places on higher and lower slopes, may affect balance on ridges at times.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Risk of rain mainly later in day Most of the day dry. In afternoon, some spots from high cloud may develop in west, then risk of some bursts of rain forming into evening from the west. Greater risk of rain widely onward into night, some heavy.
Cloud on the hills?	Likely none until late Rare if any brief patches around upper slopes, forming mainly later in day if rain develops, filling in near coast toward dusk.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Above 90% until late
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Some weak sunshine through thin high cloud; beware sunburn. Cloud tends to thicken afternoon. Some haze, although generally very good visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m)	15C rising to 18C afternoon, humid.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

	Tuesday 4 August	Wednesday 5 August
How windy? (On the summits)	Generally southerly 20 or 25mph.	West-southwesterly, speed may vary during day, but mostly in range 25 to 40mph, risk up to 50mph north tops.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly fairly small - gusty near showers	Ease of walking affected, at times more strenuous and making balance challenging on ridges. Marked wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Risk heavy showers Patchy drizzly rain possible at first before becoming dry. In afternoon heavy, possibly thundery showers may develop.	Showery rain Rain most common on western hills, may be locally frequent with odd heavier showers. Scattered showers passing eastwards.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive, although may clear at times afternoon In morning, expect blanket of fog across higher ares, sometimes the cloud below 500m or 300m near Llyn peninsula. Will improve as general cloud base lifts to 500 to 700m, and perhaps clears at times east Wales and north of A5.	Fairly extensive Covering many higher slopes much of the day above 500-700m, lowest and most persistent west coasts and during rain. Some breaks forming where dry in east.
Chance of cloud free summits?	30%	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Occasional sunshine. Hazy, and visibility poor in rain.	Brief sun breaking through mainly east. A general slight haze, reduced further in rain.
How Cold? (at 900m)	14C	9 or 10C, little change all day. Feeling near or below freezing in the stronger wind.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 4 August, 2026**

Low pressure circulates slowly over Britain into midweek bringing areas of rain and thundery showers widely, accompanied by brisk winds up to gale force for periods. Trending toward westerlies later in the week and next weekend, by then most rain and low cloud in western Scotland, but showery rain elsewhere at times. Generally fresh temperatures widely, often in mid-single figures over Scottish high tops. Despite falls of rain, beware of ongoing fire management restricting access to hills locally.

Forecast issued at 16:00 on Sunday, 2 August, 2026
