

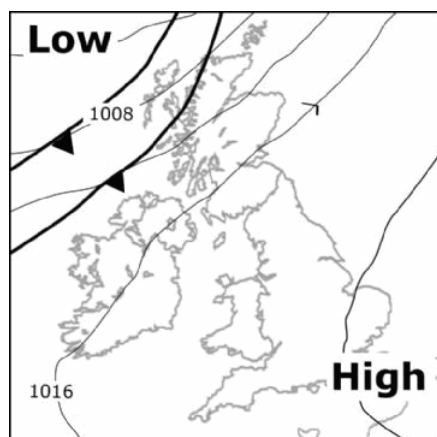
Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

General Summary for Saturday, 8 August, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 8 August, 2026

Ranging from persistent gales, and increasingly toward west and north, rain and fog across the Scottish Highlands to blustery but largely dry Cumbria and S Scotland.
 Extensively warm and sunny elsewhere.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Fine warm and sunny - beware sunburn.

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 8 August, 2026

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Southerly 20mph although lighter post dawn and again in evening. Above about 800m on Snowdon range, probably 25mph for several hours through middle of day Fairly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Little if any Chance cloud coming and going above 400m on hills toward Lleyn peninsula 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive or unbroken bright sunshine. Excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	9C rising to 13 or 18C, coldest west coastal slopes. Above the summits.

Eryri / Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	Sunday 9 August	Monday 10 August
How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly 20 to perhaps 30mph higher tops near and north of Snowdon.	Northwesterly 15mph, dropping to very low speeds by afternoon.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly fairly small, although may well impede walking at times on higher summits northern Snowdonia NP.	Becoming negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Little or perhaps no rain Chance of a little rain, most likely northernmost hills, where later in day may turn more widely drizzly.	Rain very unlikely
Cloud on the hills?	Generally confined to or above higher areas Some uncertainty: Cloud may not clear above 800-1000m westernmost slopes, and possibility of patches coming in - probably afternoon onwards - below 300m near west coast and 600m well inland. Northwest Wales most likely to be affected by this.	Mostly or all clearing during morning Snowdon range: Cloud base rising through morning to 800 to about 1050m (some uncertainty at present as to whether highest tops will clear). Elsewhere, little if any.
Chance of cloud free summits?	450%	60%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchy sunshine; very good visibility - although will deteriorate in rain.	Periods of sun - perhaps through areas of high level cloud and the Snowdon range may be intermittently cloudy. Excellent superb visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m)	11 to well inland in afternoon 15C.	8C, rising to 13 to 17C, warmest well inland.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 9 August, 2026

Extensively fine and warm early next week - indeed very little rain or low cloud and frequently light winds England and Wales all week.

Generally less settled after midweek northwestwards across Scotland where occasional rain and areas of low cloud.

Forecast issued at 16:00 on Friday, 7 August, 2026
