

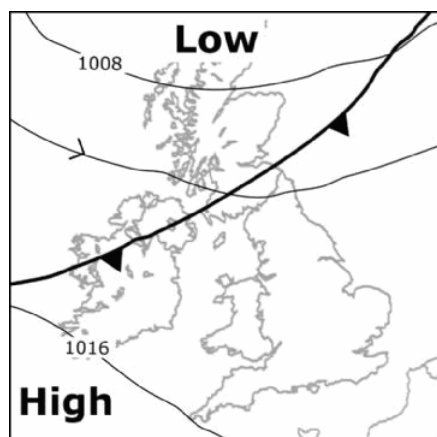
Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

General Summary for Sunday, 9 August, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 9 August, 2026

A cold front, bringing rain and low cloud will progress only slowly southeast into central Britain. To the north, drizzly showers and low cloud will affect western mountains (mainly NW Highlands) whilst to the south mostly sunny and very warm.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Blustery; risk of a little rain and low cloud north from Snowdon area.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 9 August, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly 20 to perhaps 30mph higher tops near and north of Snowdon.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly fairly small, although may well impede walking at times on higher summits northern Snowdonia NP.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain very unlikely Small risk of rain briefly Snowdon range - early in day and again toward dusk.
Cloud on the hills?	Very little if any The mountains very likely to be cloud free. But toward or during evening, chance westernmost slopes (most likely near Llyn peninsula) patches beginning to come in above 300m,
Chance of cloud free summits?	Greater than 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive, sometimes hazy, sunshine as cloud thins during morning; excellent visibility. Possibly cloudy again evening north from Llyn peninsula.
How Cold? (at 900m)	11C, rising a little although in afternoon 18C easternmost summits.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

How windy? (On the summits)	Northwesterly 15mph, dropping to very low speeds by afternoon.	Southerly 10 or 15mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Becoming negligible	Mostly negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Mostly or all clearing during morning Snowdon range: Cloud base rising through morning to 800 to about 1050m (some uncertainty at present as to whether highest tops will clear). Elsewhere, little if any.	Very unlikely
Chance of cloud free summits?	60%	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive sunshine - perhaps through areas of high level cloud and the Snowdon range may be intermittently cloudy (most likely morning). Excellent or superb visibility.	More or less unbroken sunshine. Excellent or superb visibility - haze may develop east Wales.
How Cold? (at 900m)	8C, rising to 13 to 17C, warmest well inland.	11C rising to 21C
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 10 August, 2026**

Extensively fine and warm until Wednesday.

The almost completely dry and warm weather will then persist across England and Wales - although sometimes a little rain and low cloud toward Cumbria. Underfoot conditions will remain exceptionally dry.

Scotland, especially the W& NW Highlands, will have intermittent rain and low cloud - although probably still one or two fairly brief dry periods.
