

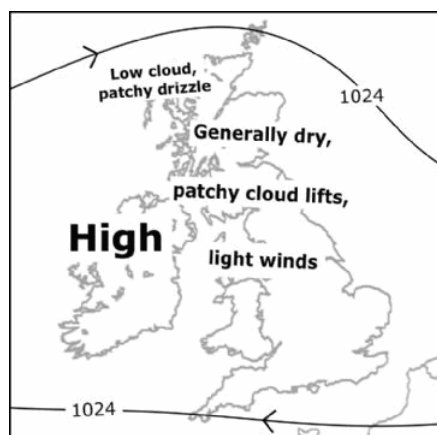

General Summary for Sunday, 23 August, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 23 August, 2026

A fine day for most places with light winds. Patchy cloud around some hill slopes early in the day will lift to leave many summits clear, but cloud banks are likely to persist on west coastal tops in Scotland, a little drizzle here in the morning, breezier too in the far northwest.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Early cloud northern hills tends to lift, largely dry.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 23 August, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Northerly at first then variable mostly less than 10mph, some upslope breezes forming.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Soon dry A little fine drizzle in cloud on northern slopes from dawn, soon fading to be dry.
Cloud on the hills?	Mostly tops in north in morning Patchy cloud banks on some northern hills early in the day, also locally mist on some low slopes inland. Becoming confined to patches around high summits in morning, then dispersing or lifting above tops.
Chance of cloud free summits?	60%, rising to 90% afternoon.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Cloudy morning toward north coasts, patchy cloud and sun inland and south, becoming sunnier near coasts afternoon. Very good visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m)	7C rising to 10 to 12C, warmest towards mid-Wales.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 24 August, 2026

A fine start to the week with high pressure nearby, but easterly breezes will tend to strengthen. Most places dry through Monday and Tuesday, but generally deteriorating from the south into midweek as low pressure moves in from the south, patchy rain will increasingly spread northward with some local stronger wind. Broadly unsettled as next weekend approaches with bands of heavy rain forming mixed with showery bursts at times, but fairly warm and somewhat humid. Wind speed and direction likely to vary considerably day-to-day.

Forecasts are issued daily by 16:30 and are kept under review and amended as necessary. However, expected conditions can still change after issue. © Copyright Mountain Weather Information Service, 2026.
