

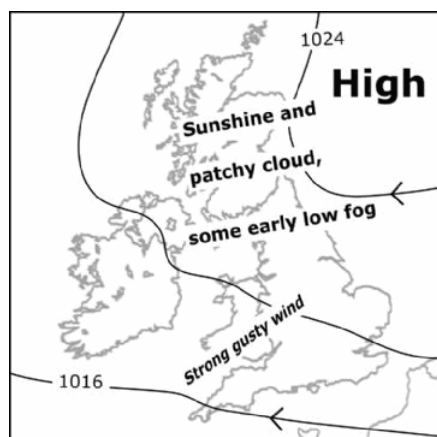

General Summary for Monday, 24 August, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 24 August, 2026

Dry overall with sunshine and broken cloud. Some early low-level fog patches will soon disperse, briefly cloud drifting over some hill slopes, but most mountains often clear all day. Light-moderate south-southeasterly breezes, locally gusty, stronger easterly winds mid & south Wales.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Increasing breezy, gusty. Dry with sun, clear hills.

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 24 August, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Southeast 10-15mph at first, becoming easterly during morning 15-25mph, speeds rising from the south and increasingly gusty in places, later in day 30mph, soonest mid Wales; some stronger gusts up to dusk and onward.
Effect of wind on you?	Starting small, but the breeze notably picks up in exposure through the day, into evening starting to affect ease of walking and balance on tops and ridges.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Hills clear A little patchy mist on low slopes in the morning, soon lifting and dissipating for clear hills.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Above 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly sunny, some thin high cloud builds with time. Good visibility but some haze mainly morning.
How Cold? (at 900m)	10C rising to 13C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Eryri / Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	Tuesday 25 August	Wednesday 26 August
How windy? (On the summits)	Easterly 20 to 30mph.	Easterly 25-30mph and gusty early in day, becoming south-southeasterly 15-20mph or less.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small but feeling breezy over higher terrain, in places may start to affect balance on exposed tops and ridges.	Early gustiness tending to ease to become fairly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain unlikely Chance of a little fine drizzle where in early cloud banks in east. Into night, possibly an odd burst of rain moving up from the south.	Early rain, risk thundery bursts later A risk of steady rain and drizzle over a few hours early in the day, tending to clear northwards. Then during afternoon into evening, risk of heavier bursts of rain forming with possible thunder.
Cloud on the hills?	Little or none Patchy cloud banks on some eastern slopes for a few hours from dawn will all clear.	Fairly extensive, lifting, some breaks Cloud fairly widely shrouding hills above 400-600m from dawn, some lower banks toward east. Tending to rise and break, but patches may cling around some high tops.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%	20% rising to 60%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sun and thin high cloud. Visibility very good west, slight haze looking eastward.	Occasional weak sun through high cloud, often overcast. Hazy start, visibility improving to be good when dry.
How Cold? (at 900m)	9C rising to 13C.	12C rising to 14C, quite humid. Feeling like 5C in the wind at first.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 25 August, 2026**

Low pressure to the south will develop and drift across Britain into the second half of this week bringing increasingly wet conditions widely. Areas of rain will drift northward during Wednesday, possibly thundery showers forming over England & Wales. Heavy and thundery rain likely affects England, Wales & southern Scotland on Thursday-Friday, potentially prolonged heavy falls bringing a risk of flooding locally. Northwest Scotland likely driest. The eastern Highlands often covered in low cloud. Strong gusty easterly winds prevail for a few days through midweek. Into the weekend it remains unsettled with areas of rain and heavy showers, plus cooler northwesterly winds developing.
