

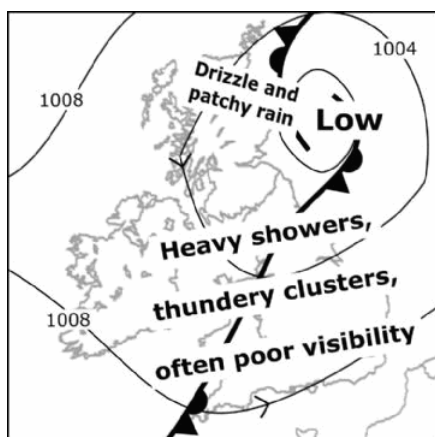

General Summary for Friday, 28 August, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 28 August, 2026

Frequent rain for England and Wales well into the day, clustering into heavy falls and local thunderstorms; poor visibility on many tops and some fast flowing streams. Easing to lighter showers later. Rain and drizzle over north and notably east Scotland, best of clear hills west highlands. Widely warm and humid.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Showers, some heavy and thundery; warm and humid

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 28 August, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	A varied westerly, generally 15-25mph; will ease briefly, speeds to 10mph or lower.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, gusty periods on high terrain.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Drizzle and showers, frequent and heavy for a time Drizzly on the high tops and upper western slopes. Shower breaking out here and there, becoming frequent and clustering together for several hours, some heavy falls with a risk of thunder. Clearing east with time, followed by patchy rain.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive, some variability Hills shrouded from middle slopes up at least in the morning, briefly rising, breaks possibly towards 700-800m towards Carneddau for a time, but lowering again as heavier showery rain arrives, blanket cloud filling in to middle slopes at least with patches as low as western valleys.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of sun but more often overcast. Varied visibility, generally poor on high terrain in cloud and rain, but locally very good on lower slopes during dry windows.
How Cold? (at 900m)	11 or 12C; humid.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 29 August, 2026

Westerly flow is expected next week, drawing cloud and showers into western areas, particularly in Scotland, with periods of strong wind and broader areas of rain more widely across the country. Best of bright breaks to the east.
