

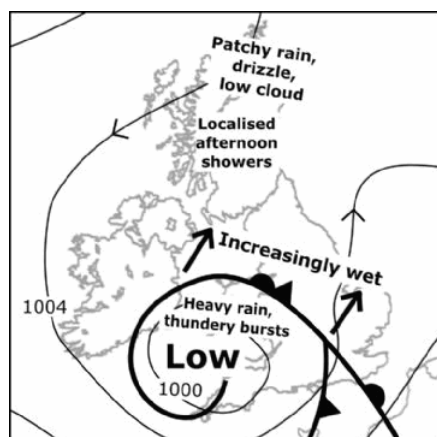

General Summary for Saturday, 29 August, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 29 August, 2026

Northerly winds bring cloud and some light rain to northern Scotland, but winds fall light for much of the Highlands - varied low cloud banks tend to rise, isolated showers possible afternoon. Rain for Wales from early morning, extending further north over England during the day, often heavy, risk thunder.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Rain persistent, often heavy; low cloud, varied wind.

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 29 August, 2026

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Direction varying considerably during the day - starting southerly, turning easterly before midday, then northerly by late afternoon, westerly from dusk; often in range 15 to 25mph, at times gusts over 30mph. Fairly small effect on walking, but some blustery spells over exposed high terrain.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain most of the day, heaviest sustained falls in the morning Rain through most of morning, heavy falls come and go or in places set in persistently, risk of local thunder. Breaking up somewhat into afternoon, but rain and drizzle remains frequent over hills with some heavier bursts likely returning for periods.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Extensive Cloud rarely breaking above 500m, bases regularly approaching low slopes, and to valley level on windward slopes during heaviest rain. Bases will tend to rise late in the day and break up somewhat but high summits unlikely to clear. 10%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Overcast and dull. Poor visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	10 or 11C, little change all day. Feeling around 5C in strongest wind. Above the summits.

All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 30 August, 2026

A generally unsettled outlook through the extended weekend and into the start of September with frequent rain and strong winds. Areas of low pressure and frontal systems move in from the Atlantic . Dropping cooler, notably chilly over Scottish mountains into Tuesday, close to freezing point on highest summits with significant wind chill in strong westerlies. A brief window of better conditions into Wednesday soon deteriorates from the west as southwesterly winds strengthen , reaching gale force over the mountains frequently in the second half of the week. Heavy rain most prolonged in the west where increasingly wet underfoot. Likely staying unsettled into next weekend and the following week.

Forecast issued at 16:29 on Friday, 28 August, 2026
