

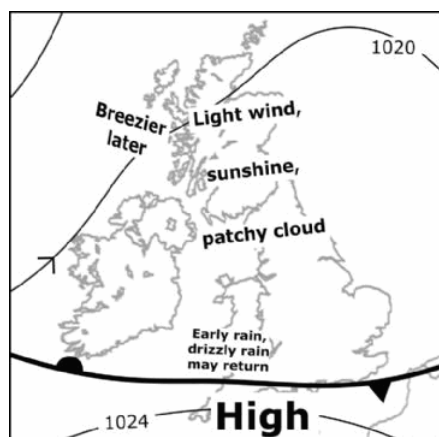

General Summary for Sunday, 13 September, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 13 September, 2026

A fine day for most places with light winds. Varied cloud around some hill slopes early in the day tending to lift and break, sunny spells. Risk of more cloud lingering over hills in Wales, some rain and drizzle in the south as a front stays nearby. Southwesterly breezes increase later western Scotland.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Early drizzle, low cloud, tending to lift; wind drops light.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 13 September, 2026

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Westerly 15-25mph at dawn, strongest toward mid-Wales, easing during morning, to 10mph by middle of day, later southwesterly. Rising again from dusk into night to 25mph. Feeling chilly in a fresh breeze early morning, becoming small most of day.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Patchy drizzly rain fades, then dry until late A little light rain or drizzle mostly on hills nearer the coast early in the day, but fading to be generally dry. By evening onward, drizzly rain tending to drift back in from the south mainly over western hills.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Low cloud in morning lifts and breaks to patches on tops Fairly extensive from dawn into morning, varied to some lower slopes in western areas; some tops may emerge between cloud banks at times. Tending to thin and lift above 800m during morning, some patches come and go on high tops afternoon, mainly west. Into night, low cloud tending to fill in again from southwest. 20% rising to 50% west, 80% east.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of sun, breaking through best in east during morning, then some sunnier spells near coast afternoon. Some misty slopes, but visibility becoming excellent out of cloud.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	9 to 11C, little change all day, then rising slightly higher onward into night. Feeling like 3C in early wind. Above the summits.

All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 14 September, 2026

Staying unsettled during the next week to 10 days as westerlies prevail - areas of low pressure passing north of Scotland with frontal systems bringing frequent rain, wettest over western mountains in Scotland. Often windy, gale-force westerly winds for periods over higher terrain. Fairly warm and humid on Monday, then on the cooler side for several days, with considerable wind chill on the mountains. Higher pressure and better weather tends to expand further north later in month.

Forecasts are issued daily by 16:30 and are kept under review and amended as necessary. However, expected conditions can still change after issue. © Copyright Mountain Weather Information Service, 2026.
