
# Southeastern Highlands

# General Summary for Wednesday, 24 April, 2024



### British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 24 April, 2024

Widely dry but cold. Occasional snow flurries or hail on high ground. Highlands: widespread cloud layer on upper slopes at first, highest summits may be above this. Lifting and clearing away from the west coast. Elsewhere: odd patch of cloud but most summits will be cloud free all day.

Feeling cold. Morning cloud clearing.

# Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 24 April, 2024

How windy? (On the Munros)	Northerly 15 to 20mph, occasionally 25mph mainly east from Glenshee. Becoming northwesterly 15mph after a temporary easing around midday.	
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small effect on walking. Marked wind chill higher eastern slopes, but feeling pleasant where sheltered in the sun.	
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rare showers</b> Chance of a brief flurry of soft hail or snow, mainly in the afternoon.	
Cloud on the hills?	Little if any Brief patches on some higher slopes in the morning. Cloud above most or all tops by afternoon.	
Chance of cloud free Munros?	80%	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Broken cloud and sun. Visibility excellent.	
How Cold? (at 900m)	-2C rising to +2 or 3C. Wind chill feels like -5C to locally -10C in morning on some tops.	
Freezing Level	600-700m early morning, plus frost in sheltered glens at first, rising toward 1200m afternoon.

#### Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Thursday 25 April	Friday 26 April
How windy? (On the Munros)	Northerly 15 to 25mph, strongest eastern areas.	Light winds, likely northeasterly but may be variable in direction.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small effect on walking most places, but locally considerable chill factor over higher terrain.	Negligible.
How wet?	Showers developing	Risk of showers
(Precipitation and its impact)	A scattering of showers forming increasingly during the day, with hail, plus snow flurries at times falling to mid-heights.	Showers developing, especially in the afternoon. Will fall as sleety snow or hail on high ground.
Cloud on the hills?	Occasionally on higher areas	Lifting above most tops
	Patches of cloud forming over some slopes in the morning, bases lifting toward the summits and many mountains will clear. Local fragments returning around showers.	Patches of cloud on higher slopes, especially during and after showers. Base rising towards or above highest tops.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	70%	70%
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Variable cloud and sun, best in morning. Visibility excellent.	Patchy sunshine in morning will give way to mostly overcast skies in afternoon. Excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m)	-2C rising to 0C east to +2 or 3C west. Wind chill feeling like -5 to -10C, coldest in morning in east.	-3C in morning rising to 3C.
Freezing Level	700-800m at first, plus frost in glens; rising to 900 to 1200m, highest central highlands afternoon.	As low as 600m in morning in eastern areas. Frost many glens at dawn. Rising to 1200m mid-afternoon onwards.

## Planning Outlook

#### All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 25 April, 2024

Remaining cold, especially northern England and Scotland. Initially winds remaining light but showers becoming more likely, falling as snow on high ground. Small but active low bringing wind and precipitation to England and Wales on Saturday and across UK on Sunday. Remaining showery into the early part of next week.

#### Forecast issued at 16:30 on Tuesday, 23 April, 2024
