

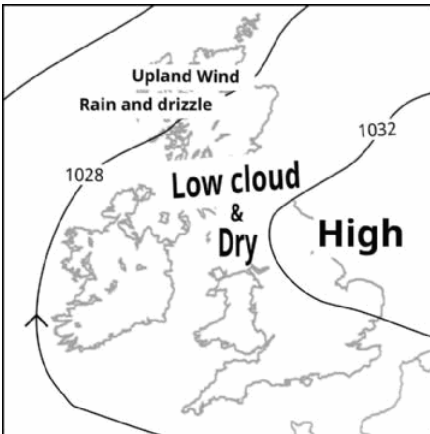
Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Ben Alder, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Saturday, 2 November, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 2 November, 2024

Widely dull and murky, breaks in cloud most likely in eastern Scotland and western Wales. Rain or drizzle in West and Northwest Highlands, elsewhere most likely dry. In northern Scotland windy, elsewhere mostly light winds. Mild.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Cloudy and partly dull, mostly dry, locally windy, mild

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 2 November, 2024

How windy? (On the Munros)	Southwesterly, mostly 10 to 20mph, on highest tops perhaps 25-30mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, north of Pitlochry and Glenshee may be at times blustery and gusty with marked wind chill and affected comfortable walking.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain unlikely Low risk occasional drizzle from low cloud.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive at start, likely partly breaking Hills covered in cloud from lower slopes upward at start, cloud slowly lifting to upper slopes, may partly break. Chance for more breaks in cloud already in the morning east of Glenshee.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	40%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Very little or no sun. Very good visibility if not in cloud.
How Cold? (at 900m)	7 or 8C, wind chill brings temperatures down to near freezing.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	Rain unlikely Extensively dry, but drizzle here and there.
Cloud on the hills?	Varied cloud banks, tending to clear Low cloud and fog in glens, with varied banks of cloud on some mid-slopes, leaving tops clear or above cloud banks. Fog dissipating during the day, may largely break up across the region.	Extensive - perhaps highest tops above cloud Cloud probably extensive above 600 to 800m, although may break up in places. Highest tops could be above the cloud layer. Additionally, patches of fog some lower slopes, particularly morning.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	80%	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine increasingly widely and excellent visibility if above the cloud. Hazier or misty lower down in morning.	Sunshine coming through in some places, but overall cloudy or dull. Hazy (though were above the cloud excellent visibility).
How Cold? (at 900m)	Around 10C, lower down colder.	5C
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 3 November, 2024**

High pressure conditions for the weekend and beginning of next week. Inversion developing means often very misty or cloudy, but tops sometimes above cloud - especially the Munros. Southwesterly winds, dry and mild conditions. Such scheme holds until Tuesday afternoon, when a weak front passage will deteriorate weather for a day along the western coastal mountains especially. Later another few days of often cloudy, but dry and even warmer weather. Winds may speed up again end of next week. During the weekend, more often wet conditions are likely, but at this stage uncertainty is still fairly high.
