
# Southeastern Highlands

# General Summary for Sunday, 3 August, 2025



## **British Mountain Summary:**

## Based on forecast chart for noon 3 August, 2025

Rain, low cloud and fog ahead of a front will clear Scotland late morning and England and Wales afternoon - but high humidity may maintain a little drizzle and low cloud Wales (most likely SW). Cloud base may not rise sufficiently to clear higher mountains mainly in W Scotland.

#### **Headline for Southeastern Highlands**

Improving: wind easing; rain clearing to the odd shower, low cloud clearing.

# **Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 3 August, 2025**

Westerly, soon 20-25mph. strongest near central belt, but up to 35mph post dawn. By mid afternoon, 15 to 20mph across region.	
Soon fairly small.	
Rain on and off clearing to the odd shower by later morning.  From dawn, frequent rain and drizzle until mid or late morning (easing from west).  Then extensively dry, but perhaps a few showers afternoon.	
Fog across the mountains; improving markedly - clearing afternoon.  From dawn, extensive across the mountains.  By mid or late morning, cloud base 600-900m, a little higher near and east of Glenshee.  Into afternoon, little cloud at all on the summits.  Less than 10%, rising to 90% by mid afternoon	
Patchwork of sunshine coming through from west middle of day onwards, sunniest east of A9.  Good visibility although slight haze.	
Between 10 and 13C generally warmest easternmost summits.  Above the summits

How windy? (On the Munros)  Effect of wind on you?	South abruptly westerly; rapid variations in speed; often above 50mph, in afternoon 90mph.  Expect difficult conditions from lowest slopes up. Frequently any mobility challenging together with severe wind chill.	West to northwesterly; slowly easing through day from 40 to 50mph post dawn to 30-35mph by early evening.  Widely difficult or strenuous walking and considerable wind chill, particularly morning.
How wet?	Rain most of the day, often heavy	Showers, mainly afternoon
(Precipitation and its impact)	Rain soon extensive and heavy - particularly west of A9. Generally more showery later in day	Occasional showers developing, most likely afternoon.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensively shrouding the mountains	Cloud base rising: nearly all summits clearing

Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Rare glimpses, if any, of sun. Visibility frequently poor.	Occasional sunshine toward Ben Alder; east and southwards, progressively sunnier.
How Cold? (at 900m)	6C, although temporarily up to 10C. Directly in the wind, feeling as cold as -10C.	6C; rising a couple of degrees or so through day.  Feeling well below freezing point in the wind

## All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 4 August, 2025

A mixed week: unusually stormy for August on Monday northern Britain, then intermittent rain though the week, most frequent and heaviest western mountains together with areas of low cloud and pulses of strong wind.
