

Southeastern Highlands


The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Erich, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Friday, 15 August, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 15 August, 2025

Continuing fairly humid. Extensive low cloud and patchy drizzly rain N Scotland; but elsewhere extensively dry with areas of very low cloud gradually clearing to give sunshine.

Blustery far north and northeast Scotland, elsewhere light wind.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Little wind. Patches of sunshine, after some fog at first. Chance shower.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 15 August, 2025

How windy? (On the Munros)	Northwesterly 10mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Little or no rain Risk isolated pockets of drizzle morning and then of a few heavier showers afternoon toward and east of Glenshee.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free Munros?	Mostly or all clearing Low confidence morning; ribbons of fog in and above some valleys, whilst some or most higher areas are above the fog. Progressively improving with only scattered cloud, if any, on highest tops in the afternoon. 70%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine increasingly breaking through Fog clearing to excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	11C rising to 18C. Above the summits.

Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Saturday 16 August	Sunday 17 August
How windy? (On the Munros)	Direction varied; almost calm on some summits, rarely more than 10mph.	East or southeasterly 10mph or less.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible	Negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain very unlikely Risk isolated fine drizzle morning, and toward and east of Glenshee of a heavier shower in the afternoon.	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Very extensive morning, but all or nearly all clearing Varied after dawn: Patchy or extensive fog valleys and lower slopes after dawn, and also areas of cloud higher up. Will improve, by late morning as nearly all cloud lifts above the summits - but possibly patches reforming near rain.	Little if any Fog a few lower slopes and valleys after dawn will all clear.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	30% rising to 90%	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Cloud breaking slowly later morning to widespread bright sunshine. Excellent or superb visibility once the fog and mist clears.	Extensive or unbroken bright sunshine. Superb visibility after fog some valleys at first.
How Cold? (at 900m)	Ranging between 7 and 11C after dawn to 15 to 17C afternoon.	11C post dawn; as high as 19C mid to late afternoon, but nearer 15C Angus and near central belt.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 16 August, 2025

High pressure, generally centred near northern Britain, will persist well into next week. Extensively dry, warm and sunny, although sometimes low cloud will affect more eastern mountains, and into next week there is uncertainty as to the penetration of rain (including thunderstorms) into Britain from the southwest.

Very dry, or becoming very dry again underfoot with significant fire risk.

Forecast issued at 13:45 on Thursday, 14 August, 2025
