

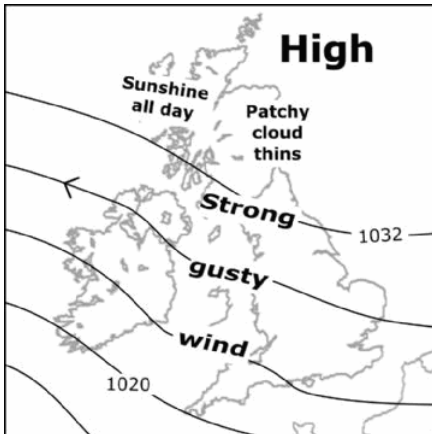
Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Wednesday, 22 April, 2026



British Mountain Summary:
Based on forecast chart for noon 22 April, 2026

Easterly winds, very gusty around higher tops and downslope to the west, strongest over England and particularly Wales, where gale-force in places. Dry overall, sunshine all day in western areas, whilst patchy cloud around eastern hills will tend to thin and retreat away to the coast.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Gusty wind. Cloud breaking to give increasing sun.

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 22 April, 2026

How windy? (On the Munros)	Easterly 20mph, but local gusty spots 25-30mph, typically strongest around higher mountains nearer the central belt.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, but locally uncomfortable gusts, not just on higher slopes. Feeling chilly in exposure.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No precipitation expected
Cloud on the hills?	Patches some mid-upper slopes Some cloud banks early in the day, mostly toward the east, patchier westwards; base around 600-700m, whilst tops above 1100m likely poke above the cloud. Tending to disperse.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	80% rising above 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine and broken cloud around some hills for a time; lower eastern areas may be under cloudier skies for a few hours. Visibility excellent out of cloud.
How Cold? (at 900m)	0 to 2C rising to 4 to 6C afternoon, typically warmest central highlands west of A9. Feeling sub-zero directly in the wind.
Freezing Level	Around freezing on some higher slopes in the morning, also frost in glens at dawn. Rising above freezing to tops.

Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

How windy? (On the Munros)	Southeasterly 10 to 15mph, local gusty 20mph some mountains in Callander area.	Variable 10mph or less.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small.	Negligible.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No precipitation expected	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Little or none Patchy fog in glens, possible low cloud around some southern hill slopes for a time, fragments may drift briefly upslope, but all dispersing.	Some early low mist, otherwise clear Patchy mist in the glens at dawn, perhaps a broader layer over the eastern lowlands and towards the Ochils. Mist briefly begins lifting upslope after sunrise but soon dissipates for cloud-free hills.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	Above 90%	Practically certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Increasingly sunny, possibly thin high cloud. Visibility excellent.	Extensive sunshine. Very good visibility, slight low-level haze toward central belt.
How Cold? (at 900m)	5C rising to 9C, locally warmer during afternoon.	8C rising to 11 or 12C. (Glens start much cooler, then approach 20C afternoon).
Freezing Level	Frost in glens and some sheltered higher areas at dawn. Otherwise above freezing to the summits.	Above the summits. At dawn, slight frost in some glens and possibly sheltered elevated hollows.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 23 April, 2026

A settled spell of weather onward through late week into the weekend, with increasingly warmer temperatures on the hills, reaching 10C+ on many tops. Valleys and some sheltered higher areas will start with a risk of frost but increasingly by the afternoons many valleys will warm up toward 20C, particularly in the west. Briefly cooler air may extend back into northeastern areas over the weekend. Strong April sunshine widely across the mountains, beware risk of sunburn. Misty starts in some valleys. After a gusty easterly during midweek, the wind will drop light for most places by late this week. A settled springtime outlook is likely for next week.
