

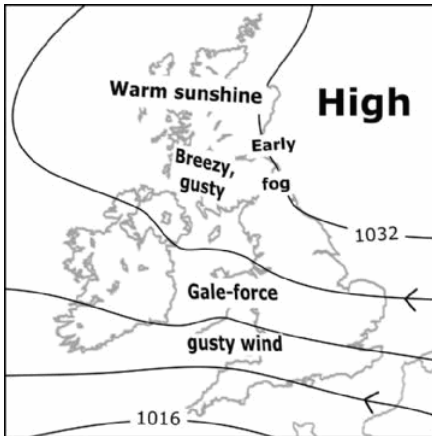
# Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.

## General Summary for Wednesday, 29 April, 2026



**British Mountain Summary:**  
**Based on forecast chart for noon 29 April, 2026**

Dry with extensive strong sunshine all day, beware sunburn. Patchy low-level fog soon clearing early morning. Fairly light wind for much of the Highlands, but gustier further southwest. Strong and gusty easterlies for England and particularly Wales, powerful gale-force gusts downslope in places.

**Headline for Southeastern Highlands**

Light wind, becoming gustier. Patchy fog, sunshine.

## Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 29 April, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>	Southeasterly, 10mph or sometimes less in morning, but some gusty spots 20mph particularly Callander area. Tending to increase a little into afternoon, by evening widely 20mph, gusts 30mph in west.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Mostly negligible in morning, some more noticeable gusts afternoon onward in central highlands, more blustery by evening.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>No rain expected</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Early low-level fog clears</b> Fog from dawn in glens and on some lower slopes, but most hills above the layer. Brief patches lift upslope, but all dispersing during the morning.
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>Practically certain (hills above early fog)</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Widely sunny with excellent visibility, though misty in places lower down at first.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	7 to 9C, small rise into afternoon, mainly central highlands.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits. Slight frost at dawn in sheltered glens.

## Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Thursday 30 April	Friday 1 May
<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>  <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	South to southeasterly 20 to 35mph, gusty in places, particularly more eastern hills, perhaps around high tops more widely.  <b>Fairly small, but some more noticeable gusty spots, more blustery on some slopes, not just the high tops.</b>	South to southwesterly, 15 to 20mph, occasional gusts developing, especially if showers occur.  <b>Mostly fairly small.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>No rain expected</b>	<b>Risk a burst of rain later</b>  High uncertainty - likely only spots from high cloud, but mainly later in day, an odd burst of rain may form, possibly thundery.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Soon none</b>  Patchy fog around lower mainly eastern slopes, also some valleys from dawn, lifting briefly upslope, though tops stay clear, and all dispersing in the morning.	<b>Clear most or all day</b>  The mountains substantially clear all day, but later if a shower occurs, odd patches may form at various heights.
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>Soon practically certain</b>	<b>Above 90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive sunshine, some thin high cloud at times. Excellent visibility.	Sun fairly weak through a veil of high cloud, which may extend across the sky. Visibility good or very good, some haze likely, particularly toward south.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	6 to 8C, slight rise mainly central areas, locally 10C afternoon. Feeling near or just below freezing directly in the wind.  Above the summits. Slight frost in glens at dawn.	10C to locally 12C afternoon, then tending to lower into evening from west.  Above the summits.

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 30 April, 2026

Dry and sunny through Thursday, but windy with powerful gusts particularly England and Wales. Then a change to more mixed conditions, with sporadic bursts of rain developing on Friday. In the short-term, very dry grass and moorland conditions over mountain terrain continues to present a very high fire risk. Lower pressure into the Bank Holiday weekend - cooler with a mix of sunny spells and showers in the extended forecast, but uncertain local details. Higher Scottish mountains particularly toward the north at least briefly dropping to around freezing over the weekend. Also expect slight frost more widely in sheltered valleys up to dawn through this week and the weekend where skies are clear.

### Forecast issued at 16:24 on Tuesday, 28 April, 2026
