

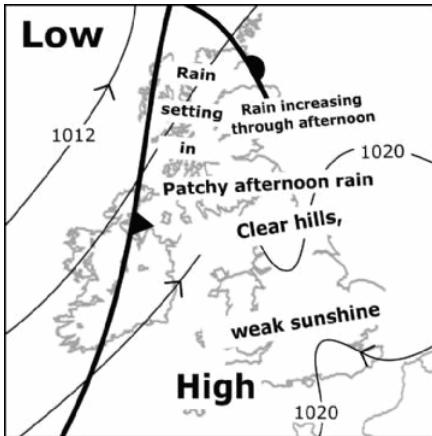
Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.

General Summary for Saturday, 30 May, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 30 May, 2026

Early patchy rain west Scotland, east hills dry and clear of cloud. Afternoon brings more substantial rain and cloud to west Scotland, spreading east with time; becoming blustery west too. Weak sun and clear hills England and Wales, mild-to-warm, notable breezes later for Eryri NP and Lakeland.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Tops mostly clear morning, increasingly wet through afternoon

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 30 May, 2026

<p>How windy? (On the Munros)</p> <p>Effect of wind on you?</p>	<p>Westerly, soon shifting southwesterly, 10-15mph, some variability around this range, and trending towards sustained speeds at least 15mph by midday. Gusting 20mph over tops, increasingly frequently through afternoon.</p> <p>Fairly small most of the day, occasional nuisance breezes over the high tops, more frequently later in the day.</p>
<p>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</p>	<p>Rain moves in from west afternoon</p> <p>Dry start, rare patchy rain encroaching in from west as midday approaches, increasingly frequent through afternoon with patches falling more widely and some heavy bursts coming and going. Perhaps a few hours of more persistent rain as evening approaches.</p>
<p>Cloud on the hills?</p> <p>Chance of cloud free Munros?</p>	<p>Forming over tops from west, low bases later afternoon</p> <p>Most mountains clear in the morning, bar odd patches. Cloud banks forming onto higher slopes from the west through afternoon, filling in above 800-900m as rain develops, lower banks towards 600m. Best chance of breaks near Glenshee.</p> <p>90% morning, dropping to 20% through afternoon</p>
<p>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</p>	<p>Patchy sun in the morning, weakened by high cloud, this thickening through afternoon, overcast later in the day.</p> <p>Very good visibility, deteriorating where rain occurs.</p>
<p>How Cold? (at 900m)</p> <p>Freezing Level</p>	<p>7C rising to 9C afternoon, or 10C far east; only slight drop in temperature with added height.</p> <p>Above the summits.</p>

Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Sunday 31 May	Monday 1 June
How windy? (On the Munros) Effect of wind on you?	West-southwesterly 20-25mph, trending westerly with time, perhaps stronger for a few afternoon hours, gusting 30mph. Fairly small, ease of walking sometimes affected on exposed tops, greatest risk afternoon.	Westerly before dawn, soon shifting southerly 10-15mph, strengthening to 15-20mph afternoon. Fairly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Some showers Morning showers, and perhaps a few hours of heavier, more persistent rain early. Breaking into only scattered showers, extended dry windows; some risk of heavy, thundery rain in the far east/Angus hills afternoon.	Patchy rain Rain from the southwest comes and goes through the day, perhaps setting in for a few hours, but generally light and patchy in nature, heaviest falls west of A9.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free Munros?	Lifting above the summits Banks of cloud above 800-9000m in the morning, locally to 600m towards Ben Lawers at dawn. Cloud largely lifts above summits by afternoon, occasional caps grazing highest tops towards the central highlands. Rising to 80%	Mostly clear morning, deteriorating afternoon Variable banks above 700m at dawn, many hills clear, and this cloud clearing for several hours around midday. Cloud will lower through afternoon, fairly extensively covering hills above 700m by evening, lower towards east lowlands. 80% lowering to 20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Early cloud breaks in to a patchwork of cloud and sunshine. Excellent visibility away from showers.	Glimpses of morning sun, soon turning mostly cloudy. Excellent visibility away from rain, deteriorating later.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	7C rising to 9C, locally 10C around Lochnagar. Above the summits.	6C rising to 9C. Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 31 May, 2026**

Changeable southwesterlies prevail as the weekend transitions into next week. Sunday sees showers for west hill groups, more widely and sometimes heavy in Scotland. Monday brings more widespread rain and wind into England and Wales, showers continue in Scotland.

An unsettled theme is expected during the first ten days of June. Frontal systems from the Atlantic bring periods of rain, wind, and low cloud. Wind speeds will vary, but reaching gale force on mountains for periods, England and Wales looking particularly vulnerable. A few brighter windows, but these brief and often interrupted by afternoon showers with a risk of local thunder. Sometimes chilly in Scotland when the wind turns northwesterly though staying above freezing to summits.
