

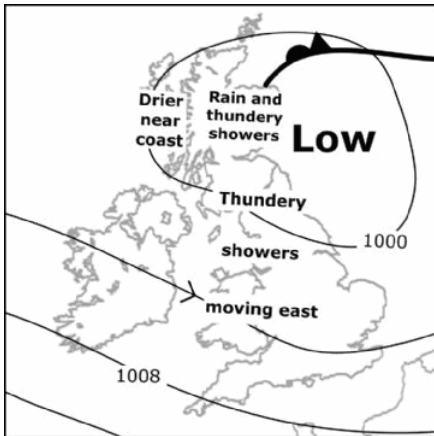
# Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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## General Summary for Tuesday, 2 June, 2026



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 2 June, 2026**

Heavy showery bursts of rain with thunder and lightning, moving eastwards over England, Wales and south-central Scotland. A zone of more persistent rain affects the Cairngorms, heavy bursts mixed in. Drier toward west coast of Scotland, improving in western England & Wales in afternoon as the breeze freshens.

### Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Mostly light wind. Areas of rain, heavy bursts, risk thunder.

## Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 2 June, 2026

<p><b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b></p> <p><b>Effect of wind on you?</b></p>	<p>Variable, mostly between north and westerly, at times below 10mph or little wind for periods, up to gustier 20mph, tending to freshen westerly later 20-25mph central highlands afternoon-evening.</p> <p><b>Mostly small, but feeling breezier later in the daytime, cool in exposure.</b></p>
<p><b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b></p>	<p><b>Showery bursts, risk lightning</b></p> <p>Areas of rain from before dawn, mostly eastern areas, some heavy, likely to move away northeastward, but leaving a legacy of showers, heavy bursts forming widely, drifting around slowly, moving eastward afternoon-evening, risk local thunderstorms.</p>
<p><b>Cloud on the hills?</b></p> <p><b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b></p>	<p><b>Fairly extensive</b></p> <p>Covering many hills especially in east in the morning, patches may linger around higher areas all day. Some varied improvements afternoon with local breaks to tops, but ragged patches lower around rain.</p> <p><b>40%</b></p>
<p><b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)</p>	<p>Glimpses of sun, though often cloudy. Visibility very good at times, reduced in showers, occasionally poor.</p>
<p><b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b></p> <p><b>Freezing Level</b></p>	<p>8C up to 10C afternoon. Feeling near to freezing later in wind.</p> <p>Above the summits.</p>

## Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Wednesday 3 June	Thursday 4 June
<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>  <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	South-southeasterly 25 to 35mph, at times 40mph around higher summits at least, risk stronger gusts.  <b>Blustery, strenuous walking in exposure, buffeting gusts on ridges and tops. Considerable wind chill.</b>	Southerly 15 to 25mph in morning. Turning southwest then westerly 30-35mph, risk 40mph later, soonest in west.  <b>Moderate effects early in day, but becoming more blustery, affecting comfortable walking. Marked wind chill.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain becomes persistent, some heavy</b> Rain extends in from the southwest early in day, becoming fairly persistent particularly west of A9, but heavier falls at times widely across the southern highlands, particularly through afternoon, risk thundery later in day.	<b>Bursts of rain on and off, risk lightning</b> Showery rain already from dawn, especially in west, ongoing throughout the day, bursts of rain frequent, at times merging to constant rain, thundery downpours tend to drift eastward afternoon-evening.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Extensive</b>  Covering most hills all day above 500 to 700m, lowest persistent cloud on south-facing slopes. Some higher breaks in east early in day, but widely lowering in rain, ragged patches lower slopes upward.	<b>Fairly extensive, varied</b>  Often covering the higher mountains all day, but varying in extent and height, some ragged patches from forest canopies up during and after rain.
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>20%</b>	<b>30%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of sun mainly eastern areas early morning. Visibility starts good below cloud, reducing around rain, increasingly widely poor.	Rare brief sun breaking through. Visibility occasionally good below cloud, but reduced in rain, at times poor.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	6 or 7C, slight rise afternoon. Wind chill feeling like -5C.  Above the summits.	6 or 7C, then tending to drop into night. Feeling close to freezing in wind, then near -5C if exposed to stronger speeds.  Above the summits.

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 3 June, 2026

An unsettled spell this week and next, as low pressure over the north Atlantic and west-southwesterly winds dominate. Periods of rain mixed with showery days widely - the most constant rain over western mountains with low cloud often shrouding the hills. Wind speed will vary, but up to gale-force for periods over the hills this week, then typically less windy next week. Temperatures near average, cooler at times. Briefly higher pressure by Saturday with fewer showers, but a further area of rain likely returns from the west during Sunday. Mid June onward shows signs of drier and warmer weather as higher pressure then expands northward with time.

### Forecast issued at 16:18 on Monday, 1 June, 2026

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
