

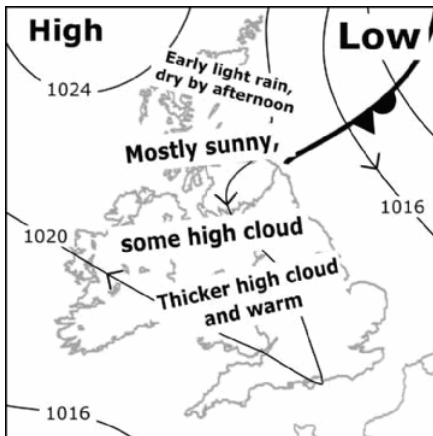
Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Sunday, 14 June, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 14 June, 2026

Some early drizzle and patchy light rain in northern Scotland fades by afternoon. Elsewhere dry all day and often sunny though some high cloud weakening sun in places; sun may be more patchy east Scotland and later northern England. Warm southern Pennines and Wales. Light wind, though starting blustery in east Scotland.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Blustery early, easing; patchy sun, more extensive later afternoon

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 14 June, 2026

<p>How windy? (On the Munros)</p> <p>Effect of wind on you?</p>	<p>Northwesterly 20-30mph dawn, strongest east and gusty, approaching 40mph east of Glenshee/Angus hills. Shifting northerly and easing to the lower end of the range by afternoon, then widely lowering to 10-15mph into evening, always strongest east.</p> <p>Blustery in exposure in the morning, gusts in the east will challenge stability with a notable wind chill. Gradually easing to mostly small effects by later afternoon; slow to ease over Angus hills.</p>
<p>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</p>	<p>A few light patches on northern Munros</p> <p>A few spots of light rain drifting onto northern Munros, including near and east of Glenshee. Hills south of Loch Rannoch/Pitlochry entirely dry, and afternoon widely dry.</p>
<p>Cloud on the hills?</p> <p>Chance of cloud free Munros?</p>	<p>Mostly clearing</p> <p>Banks of cloud above 800m at dawn, the summits probably shrouded to start, but cloud soon lifts and begins breaking up, the summits probably clear of cloud from midday onward; caps linger longest near Glenshee, and a risk of a broader bank of cloud for a few afternoon hours.</p> <p>Rising to 90%</p>
<p>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</p>	<p>Patchy sunshine, some cloudier moments, but becoming widely sunny through later afternoon.</p> <p>Very good visibility.</p>
<p>How Cold? (at 900m)</p> <p>Freezing Level</p>	<p>5C rising to 10 or 11C; a degree cooler near and east of Glenshee.</p> <p>Feeling below freezing in early wind but, wind chill eases.</p> <p>Above the summits.</p>

Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Monday 15 June	Tuesday 16 June
How windy? (On the Munros) Effect of wind on you?	Variable 10mph or less, orienting east-southeasterly and rising to 10-15mph evening, perhaps some stronger gusts. Small.	Southerly 15-20mph, trending higher with time, tops speeds to 25-30mph over high summits afternoon. Fairly small for a time, but increasingly blustery, ease of walking affected in exposure and feeling chilly.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Dry most of daylight Late in the day, some patchy rain approaches from the southwest, but most Munros stay dry until nighttime when patches spread more widely.	Patchy rain Patchy rain drifts from the south and southwest much of the day. Dry windows probably for several midday hours, but always a risk of light patches drifting into eastern hills. Later, more frequent falls probably.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free Munros?	Largely clear until later Banks of cloud at various heights in the morning, perhaps extensive, including in glens and corries. Cloud lifts, dissipating through morning for clear Munros for a time. Some afternoon banks reforming, then a rising risk of a sheet of cloud encroaching from the southwest. 80%, later deteriorating	Extensive All hills shrouded above 600-700m all day, lower bases in the morning. Some brief higher breaks north of Loch Rannoch to Glenshee afternoon, but then returning widely extensively into evening. 10%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Becoming mostly sunny, high cloud thickening through afternoon. Very good visibility.	Overcast, often dull. Poor visibility on high terrain due to fog, better under cloud.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	4 or 5C at dawn, rising to 9 or 10C. Above the summits.	6C rising to 9C. Feeling like +1 to 3C in direct wind. Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 15 June, 2026

Through Monday, cloud will return from the southwest and bring some patchy rain with it. From Tuesday onward, a variable southwesterly will dominate through at least mid-week. Windy at times with periods of rain, drizzle and low cloud most persistent in the west; Tuesday into Wednesday is likely a wetter and unsettled period, with the unsettled weather lingering well into Wednesday in Scotland. Warmest in England and Wales, but may stay cooler in Scotland as low pressure to the northwest recycles air from the north Atlantic back onto the Munros. Pressure generally trending higher later in the week, centred southeast of England, but low pressure to the west of Ireland will prevent any extended settled periods with more windy, wet weather at times next weekend; temperatures likely become more widely warm.
