

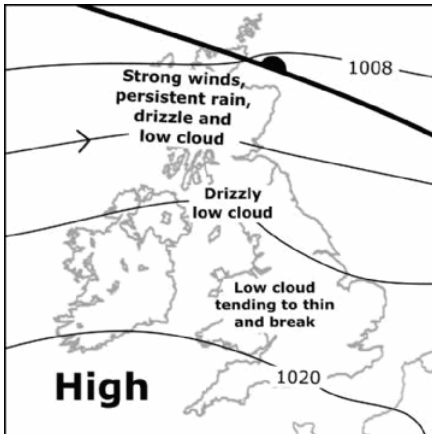
# Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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## General Summary for Monday, 6 July, 2026



### British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 6 July, 2026

Windy and generally wet across Scottish hills, rain and drizzle most persistent in northwestern Highlands. Breezy, damp and drizzly too for northern England. Drier and lighter winds for Wales. Poor visibility with low cloud cloaking many hills through the day, best of any breaks toward east.

### Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Gusting gale-force over tops. Rain, drizzle, cloud on tops.

## Detailed Forecast for Monday, 6 July, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>	Westerly 30 to 40mph, some variability, locally lower speeds on sheltered slopes middle of day into afternoon, but gusts at times over tops to 45-50mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Strenuous walking in exposure most of the day with noticeable wind chill; sometimes locally fairly small effects.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Drizzle, periods of rain in morning west</b> Often raining towards the central highlands in morning, again by evening, a lingering drizzle on the high tops during drier windows. Rain patchier towards Glenshee, best of dry windows more widely during afternoon hours.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Extensive over high terrain, at least</b> Slopes towards central highlands shrouded above 600-700m all day, lower during periods of rain with ragged patches to forest canopies. Higher bases east, local breaks towards 1000m where dry, but filling in again during rain.
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>10% west, to 30% east.</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Overcast, often dull western hill groups with poor visibility. Very good east if out of cloud and rain, an odd glimpse of sun here.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	9C rising to 10 or 11C, mildest in the east. Feeling at or below freezing in strongest wind.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

## Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	<b>Tuesday 7 July</b>	<b>Wednesday 8 July</b>
<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>  <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Westerly 35-45mph dawn, strong gusts over tops approaching 60mph; easing to 25-35mph, staying gusty.  <b>Challenging in exposure early, gusts knocking you off balance and significant wind chill. Easing but staying strenuous.</b>	West to southwesterly 15 to 25mph, occasional 30mph around high tops.  <b>Fairly small, but some noticeable gustiness in places not just on high tops.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Patchy rain, mostly west</b> Rain drifts from the west, patchy and often light in nature; some extended steadier falls may occur. Only odd spots reaching east of the A9, most often dry.	<b>Rain unlikely</b> Rare fine drizzle west-central highlands if in early low cloud on windward slopes.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Early cloud lifts, summit breaks east</b>  Fairly extensive to middle elevations early, lowest west where locally to 400m, some ragged lower patches in early rain. A lifting trend, breaks to 800-900m towards central highlands, summit breaks increasingly east of A9.	<b>Varied, mostly clearing, may linger west</b>  Banks of cloud around mid-slopes in morning, most extensive central highlands, toward Callander patches may persist all day above 800m, largely clearing elsewhere. High tops above 1100m may start above cloud.
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>20%, rising to 60% eastern Munros</b>	<b>30% rising to 70%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of weak sunshine, best east where more often later. Very good visibility below cloud; sudden changes high slopes to the west.	Varied cloud and sun in morning, then increasingly sunny with fair-weather cloud, best toward east. Visibility good or very good.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	9 or 10C, rising slightly, to 12 or 13C eastern hills. Feeling below freezing in strongest wind. Above the summits.	12C rising to 15C afternoon, locally slightly warmer easternmost hills.  Above the summits.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 7 July, 2026**

A damp start westerly pattern continues at the start of the week, particularly in Scotland, then a drier and warmer window builds into the middle of the week: very warm in England and Wales, spells of sunshine spread northward, and lighter wind. Some patchy rain continues through late week in western Scotland though detail is uncertain and more often dry. High pressure is indicated to expand across Scotland through next weekend bringing more widely dry and warm conditions in the extended outlook into mid July - easterly winds likely develop, particularly England and Wales; a chance of some thunderstorms.
