

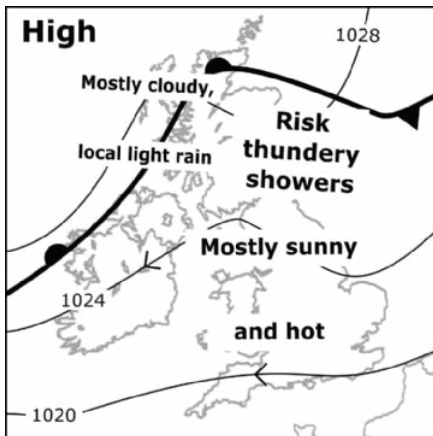
# Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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## General Summary for Saturday, 11 July, 2026



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 11 July, 2026**

Fairly cloudy Scottish highlands, drizzly tops east where a risk of thundery showers; drier west, local bright breaks. A rising risk of heavy/thundery showers forming over Southern Uplands. Very warm and sunny in England, but high cloud and a risk of showers far north later. Extensive hot sunshine for Wales.

## Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 11 July, 2026

<p><b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b></p> <p><b>Effect of wind on you?</b></p>	<p>Generally easterly 10-15mph, strongest breezes around Callander; locally lower speeds. Local sudden strong gusts in varied directions accompany heavy/thundery showers.</p> <p><b>Mostly small, but sudden strong gusts near showers will inconvenience walking .</b></p>
<p><b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b></p>	<p><b>Drizzle, patchy rain, risk thundery showers</b></p> <p>A fine drizzle on the high tops east of the A9 much of the day. Occasional patches of rain affecting most hills, a risk of pop-up heavy showers forming, mostly concentrated to eastern hills groups and moving further eastward once formed.</p>
<p><b>Cloud on the hills?</b></p> <p><b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b></p>	<p><b>Fairly extensive</b></p> <p>Extensive to low slopes at dawn, including fog into glens, particularly towards the east lowlands. Bases tending to rise, breaks to 700-900m, highest towards Loch Ericht, but any higher breaks localised and fleeting, lower patches returning where showers occur.</p> <p><b>30%</b></p>
<p><b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b></p>	<p>Overcast, sometimes dull and poor visibility on high terrain. Where below cloud, visibility will be very good.</p>
<p><b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b></p> <p><b>Freezing Level</b></p>	<p>11 to 13C, mildest towards central highlands. Where showers occur, temperature briefly drops a few degrees.</p> <p>Above the summits.</p>

## Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Sunday 12 July	Monday 13 July
<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>  <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	East-southeasterly 10mph, occasionally approaching 15mph around Callander.  <b>Small to negligible.</b>	East-southeasterly, some variability, 10-15mph, strongest southern hills where gusty to middle slopes.  <b>Fairly small, but nuisance gusts common southern hill groups with some light buffeting.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Spotty drizzle</b> A lingering drizzle on the summits in the morning, this fading. Some chance of a few spots of drizzly rain returning, but these very localised, most Munros staying dry.	<b>No rain expected</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>  <b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>Fairly extensive, breaking tendency</b>  At dawn, extensive cloud to most lower slopes, many places into glens. Lifting through morning, bases towards central highlands increasingly broken to or above 900m afternoon. East of A9 slower to break, perhaps only later in the day.  <b>20%, rising to 50% towards central highlands</b>	<b>Breaking into patchy banks</b>  Cloud may be fairly extensive at dawn, highest tops near or just above the cloud layer. Soon after sunrise cloud begins lifting with breaks forming, just patchy banks on high terrain by later in the day, little or none towards central highlands.  <b>Rising to 80%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Overcast, misty on high terrain to start. Glimpses of sun breaking out, best breaks west with very good visibility. Cloudiest near east lowlands.	A patchwork of cloud and sunshine. Very good visibility.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	10 or 11C, rising to 12C towards central highlands.  Above the summits.	9C rising to 12 or 13C, mildest towards central highlands.  Above the summits.

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 12 July, 2026

Staying very warm late weekend into next week. High pressure north of the country keeps the skies mostly clear and facilitates an easterly flow, pushing the warmest temperatures to western hill groups. Northeastern areas will see early sea fog under the high pressure, this dissipating in the sun through morning. Scottish highlands seeing temperatures often rise into the mid-teens, valley temperatures to the 20s west; warmest Wales where hill temperatures often to 20C or higher. A fairly sustained breeze most of the week in England and Wales, at times stronger and quite gusty. Low pressure south of the country may push cloud and showers into Wales, though confidence remains low, and could remain largely dry. Detail uncertain later next week, but a milder northerly flow may begin to establish.
